CALL TO ACTION: Mental Health

There are two bills that need our attention, AB 988 and AB 586.

AB 988 – is the new three-digit number for the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. The number will have trained staff to answer

calls from individuals at risk for suicide as well as those experiencing other mental health and substance use related emergencies. By July of 2022, all telecommunications companies will have to make the necessary changes so individuals can access the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline using the 988, dialing code.

AB 586 - this bill establishes the School Health Demonstration Project, to expand comprehensive health and mental health services to public school pupils by providing training and support services to selected local educational agencies to secure ongoing Medi-Cal funding for those health and mental health services, as provided. The bill requires a selected local educational agency to serve as a pilot project participant and receive \$500,000 each year of the 2-year pilot project, to be used for contracting with one of 3 technical assistance teams selected by the Superintendent of Public Instruction, which authorizes the funds for use by the local educational agency for staffing, professional development, outreach, and data analysis and reporting, related to the project. A report is submitted at the conclusion of the pilot project.
