

Worship at Wake Forest Presbyterian Church *"joyfully ascribes all praise and honor, glory and power to the Lord... Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We offer two different styles of worship, and we welcome you to try out both! You may find that you prefer one over the other, but you may also like to switch back and forth. No matter what you prefer, you can always expect a high level of engagement from the congregation, and you will always hear the same sermon in either service.

Our Contemporary Worship Service in our Christian Life Center is led by our volunteer worship band and proclaims Jesus in new music and styles that are dynamic and relevant to both the seeker and the committed Christian. Our Traditional Worship Service in our Sanctuary includes traditional hymns and anthems, with a wide range of sacred music by current arrangers and composers, led by our choir.

Communion

First Sunday of each month at both Worship Services

On the first Sunday of each month, we celebrate communion together. From the PC(USA): "The Lord's Supper enacts and seals what the Word proclaims: God's sustaining grace offered to all people. The Lord's Supper is at once God's gift of grace, God's means of grace, and God's call to respond to that grace..." All who accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior are invited to the Communion Table at Wake Forest Presbyterian Church. The grace of God is available wherever we are, and that is something to celebrate! If you are worshipping online, we ask you to have your own elements ready — though we use bread and grape juice at church, anything will work.

Ash Wednesday

March 2 at 11:30 AM and 7:00 PM in the Sanctuary

We invite you to begin your Lenten journey with us at one of our two services. Our midday service will be followed by a simple soup and sandwich lunch. *The Lenten journey from the ashes of death to resurrected life begins on the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday, which signifies a time to turn around, to change directions, to repent. Acknowledging that all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God, we stand in solidarity as fellow creatures before our Creator, acutely aware of our mortality. In the face of our transience, we pledge ourselves anew to live unto God's Word in Jesus Christ, the eternal Word that remains forever.* (from *Companion to the Book of Common Worship*)

The music ministry is comprised of Praise Team, Chancel Choir, Adult Hand Bells, and Children's Choir. Adult Mission Trip *Tentatively set for March 13-18, 2022*

In 2005, after the devastation of Hurricane Katrina on the Gulf Coast of the U.S., a group was formed to respond to this natural disaster and a ministry was formed. Groups of adults have traveled and assisted in other areas of the country with disaster recovery, mostly through the PC(USA) division of Presbyterian Disaster Relief in the years since that first trip. In recent years, the trips have been to communities in Eastern NC still impacted by the storms that come year after year. Our Fall 2021 trip took place in Wilmington, NC, working with Habitat for Humanity in one of the ReStore stores and at two home construction sites. We are tentatively planning two trips in 2022: one in the early Spring and another in the Fall. We anticipate working in Eastern NC again and then somewhere farther afield. We usually have small projects around the church campus we help with as well when the need arises. Backpack Buddies *ongoing, monthly*

Our Backpack Buddies ministry helps to feed children in our community who are facing food insecurity. We partner with three local elementary and middle schools to provide easy-to-prepare meals they can take home over the weekend when they don't have regular access to school meals. There are several ways to support this ministry by lending a helping hand. You are welcome to join our monthly packing events where we select food items and bag the meals for delivery. Volunteers are also asked to help by delivering the bagged meals for distribution to the schools. If you'd like to donate food, we routinely use canned soups, ramen noodles, canned chicken and tuna, canned pasta, mac-n-cheese, canned vegetables, canned fruit, canned chili, Pop-Tarts, oatmeal and juice boxes. (No glass please, and easy-open tab tops are always preferred.) Food donations may be dropped off in the collection bins located in the narthex donation closet or at the collection table near the CLC entrance closest to the parking lot. Blood Drive *February 6 at WFPC*

WFPC partners with The Blood Connection (TBC) to host three blood drives a year. TBC is a community blood supplier primarily serving NC, SC and GA. Donors provide lifesaving blood to neighbors and friends in our region. In addition to blood donations, there are also opportunities to volunteer time to facilitate the success of each drive. The need for blood is especially great now as drives have been impacted by the pandemic, and TBC has developed safety protocols to ensure the safety of its donors and volunteers. Community Garden *ongoing, weekly*

WFPC's Community Garden, lovingly referred to as the Giving Garden, has become a food production project providing fresh seasonal fruits and vegetables year-round. The produce we harvest helps to provide food to an average of fifty households per week through donations to our local food pantry and meal kitchens in the Wake Forest area. There is always a variety of work to be done in the garden, suitable to different ages and ability levels. With our commitment to making our garden user friendly, we have installed table planters for adults and children, including wheelchair accessible planters. The proceeds are then delivered monthly to the VA Volunteer Office emergency food pantry for veterans in need. In 2021 we held our first "Undie Sunday," requesting contributions of underwear and t-shirts to donate in addition to the food. GRIEF SHARE *Thursdays, 5:00-6:30 pm in CLC Room B104, beginning in March*

The care you need. Information you can trust. After the funeral, when the cards and flowers have stopped coming, most of the people around you return to their normal lives. But your grief continues and you feel alone. Often friends and family want to help you, but don't know how. That's the reason for GriefShare. Our group is led by caring people who have experienced grief and have successfully rebuilt their lives. We understand how you feel because we've been in the same place. We will walk with you on the long path through grief toward healing and hope for the future. GriefShare is a support group that meets weekly. You'll find it to be a warm, caring environment and will come to see your group as an "oasis" on your long journey through grief. There are three key parts to your GriefShare experience:

- Video seminar - Encouraging, information packed videos featuring leading grief recovery experts.
- Support group - Small discussion group about weekly video content.
- Workbook - Journaling and personal study exercises that reinforce the weekly session topics.




