About Lorton Community Center



In November 2016, Fairfax County voters approved the Human Services and Community Develop-

ment Bond Referendum which provided funding for the construction of two new community centers, including the new Lorton Community Center. The project includes a complete renovation of the existing 10,000-square-foot Lorton Library with a new addition of 6,000 square feet and construction of a new 30,000-square-foot single-story Community Center building.

Once completed, this location will provide a broad array of services, programs and activities for individuals of all ages and abilities throughout these communities. The new Community Center will include a gymnasium, fitness room, game room, kitchen, art room, and multipurpose rooms to be used for various activities and events like after-school programs, senior activities, computer and technology programs, therapeutic recreation, various classes, etc. The project will provide a playground and a picnic area, including picnic tables. Programming includes:

- After-school programs
- · Facility rentals
- Fitness classes
- Gym sports such as basketball, volleyball, pickleball and badminton
- Meeting spaces for groups and organizations
- Spring, summer and winter camps
- STEAM, technology and computer instruction

The LCAC has served the Fairfax County community since 1975 providing basic needs assistance, including weekly food through the pantry for more than 200 households; emergency rent and utility assistance to prevent homelessness; seasonal programs to meet school, holiday and winter coat needs; adult and children's educational opportunities; after school programs and school break/summer lunch and programmatic opportunities.

The newly renovated Lorton Library will serve its community with a collection of over 30,000 items, free Internet stations and Wi-Fi access, an expanded children's space, a teen room with gaming station, increased seating, and multiple meeting/collaboration spaces including a meeting room with after-hours access, conference rooms, and group study rooms. Library staff will present programs for children (including early literacy story times), teens, and adults.

Participating at one of Fairfax County's teen centers allows youth to grow in a supervised, structured, and enjoyable environment. The Lorton Teen Center features use of a gymnasium, computer lab, craft rooms and a kitchen. Teen center participants are mentored by positive role models and may participate in a variety of activities and projects designed to keep them engaged and support their physical, mental, academic, financial and social development. Center staff provide programming and opportunities for youth to develop skills, explore creative thinking and emphasize community building. Activities include a variety of recreational classes, educational workshops and field trips, as well as many other special events. Opportunities are also available for job coaching and training to advance future economic independence.
