

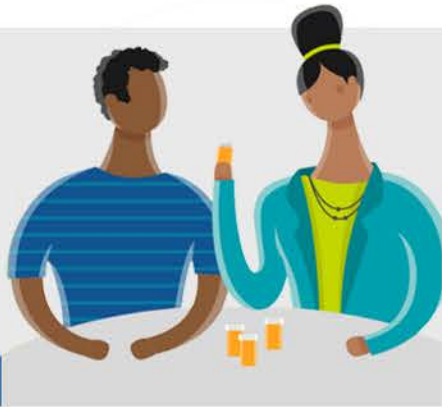


Community Health Worker

Community health workers (CHWs) are frontline public health workers who have a close understanding of the community they serve. Community health workers also build individual and community capacity by increasing health knowledge and self-sufficiency through a range of activities such as outreach, community education, informal counseling, social support and advocacy.

BUILDS TRUST

Community members turn to a Community Health Worker for information and assistance



OFFERS IN-PERSON HELP

A CHW can visit patients to help and discuss ways to improve their health.

NAVIGATES THE HEALTH CARE SYSTEM

A CHW can help patients to find appointments with primary care, and can set reminders for the patients about their appointments



PROVIDES HEALTH EDUCATION

A CHW can teach the community health related topics to keep them informed

CONNECTS COMMUNITY RESOURCES

A CHW can connect people to the right resources they need.
