"The need for these products is constant, but these products are not covered under federal assistance programs such as WIC, SNAP, or Medicaid. Given the shut-down of many nonprofits and take-away centers during this COVID pandemic, food banks are allocating their available space for food items. This means that families may have to choose between food, paying their electric bill, or buying personal care products like diapers. An inadequate supply of these items can lead to health issues," explains Rev. Charlotte LaForest, Rector of St. Andrew's. "As a community, we've been looking for a way to help those in need and are thrilled to have other partners joining us in this drive."
