



Ohio Bottle Lottery FAQs for Agencies

Q: When is the Ohio Bottle Lottery?

The Ohio Bottle Lottery begins at 12:01 a.m. Mar. 25 and ends at 11:59 p.m. Apr. 5.

Q: What is the website for consumers to enter the lottery?

A: www.com.state.oh.us/liqr/bottlelottery

Q: What products are included in the bottle lottery and how much do the products cost?

A: O.F.C. (1993 Vintage), Brand Code 1601B- \$2,499.98 and Double Eagle Very Rare, Brand Code 2779B - \$2,000.

Q: I've just received a poster, what am I supposed to do with it?

A: Please hang the poster in your Agency in an area accessible to consumers.

Q: Where are my paper tickets?

A: There are no paper tickets for this lottery. Consumers may enter online, and Agencies are encouraged to let them know to choose their Agency when entering.

Q: Does a customer have to buy their entry?

A: No. There is no purchase necessary to enter the lottery.

Q: Can consumers enter both lotteries?

A: Yes. When entering, they can choose from the dropdown menu to enter both raffles. Two separate submissions are not required to be considered for both lotteries. Additionally, if choosing both lotteries, entrants have a chance to win a product from both collections and will not be disqualified from one if chosen as a winner on the other.

Q: Can my employees enter?

A: No. Employees of the Contract Liquor Agency are not allowed to enter.

Q: I have a winner. Now what?

A: The product will be delivered to your Agency. You must hold it in a secure location until the winner comes to buy the product. When the winner arrives, please verify their identity with the list you were provided from the Division of Liquor Control and ask the winner to provide their printed entry submission page. The winner must also sign the acknowledgement form stating they purchased their bottle. All signed forms must be held until your Auditor picks it up.

Q: How long do winners have to purchase their bottle?

A: Winners will have from Apr. 22 through May 3 to purchase their bottle. Again, Agencies must hold the bottle in a secure location until the winner purchases their bottle or forfeits their right to purchase.

Q: My winner never showed up. Can I sell the bottle?

A: Agencies will receive communication from the Division of Liquor Control with instructions for handling unclaimed bottles.
