BASIC ITINERARY – please know times are approximate and subject to change based on traffic, rest stops, etc.

Thursday evening, January 20 – depart RI to DC

- 9 p.m.: bus leaves RI from drop-off points
- Pick-up/drop-off points:
 - 8:00 p.m.: St. Patrick Church, Providence
 - 8:30 p.m.: St. Mark Church, Cranston

Friday morning, January 21 – arrive in DC

- Approximately 6 a.m.: bus arrives in DC
- 7 a.m.: Holy Mass at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, 400 Michigan Ave. NE
- 8 a.m. to 10 a.m.: March for Life Expo, Renaissance Downtown DC Hotel (999 9th Street NW). This is a free opportunity for attendees to connect with pro-life organizations and ministries from across the country
- 11 a.m.: The March for Life Program begins at the National Mall (Washington Monument)
 - 11 a.m. to 12 noon: Pre-Rally Concert – a live concert and inspiring speeches from pro-life leaders!
 - 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.: The March for Life! - starting between 12th and 14th Streets, we will march peacefully up Constitution Ave. to the steps of the U.S. Supreme Court. Depending on the time, after marching, one may consider attending the Silent No More testimonies outside the Supreme Court, visiting your Representative to advocate for life, or proceeding past the Supreme Court to help the flow of oncoming marchers.

Friday evening, January 21 – depart DC to RI

- Approximately 4:30 p.m.: meet at Union Station (701 First St. NE) and leave DC

Saturday morning, January 22 – arrive back in RI

- Approximately 2 a.m.: arrive back in RI at pick-up points
