Currently, the Girls Lakeshore Softball group is moving forward with new dugouts on the North field. I'm so proud of this group for organizing this project, doing the fundraising, and now seeing it built. Plans are also in the works for updating the tennis courts and building new pickleball courts. Work will hopefully begin in late 2023 and into 2024. We hope to organize all our equipment in a dedicated enclosure at the North end of the rink and build structures to contain ball mix and wood chips used in the park. And the final part of the project is a couple years out, making sure Austin Pavilion is used to its full potential.

At the Transfer Station, Chris Legg is working with Amy Roller and her band of dedicated volunteers to man the Swap Shop every Saturday (weather permitting) through fall. Both the opening of the Swap Shop and our spring paper shredding day will be on April 22<sup>nd</sup>.
