Welcome and Christmas Proclamation

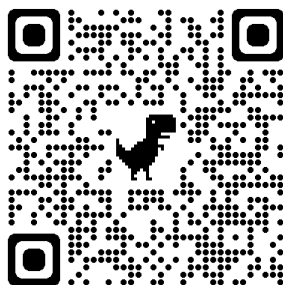
