Publication:

Scholars and practitioners are invited to contribute to the conference by submitting an abstract of their research proposal aligned with the theme of Al's role in community development and peacebuilding. The academic board will review all submitted abstracts, and the status—accepted, accepted with revisions, or not accepted—will be communicated within two weeks, along with any reviewer feedback.

Authors whose abstracts require revisions may submit an improved version before the abstract submission deadline. After final review and shortlisting, selected contributors will be invited to submit a full paper.

Full papers will undergo a similar review process, which will take approximately three weeks. Based on feedback from the academic board, authors may be asked to revise and resubmit their papers. Only papers that meet the required academic standards by the final deadline will be accepted.

Global Ministries University (GMU) will compile, peer-review, and publish all accepted and finalized full papers as a conference proceedings book.

Mode of the conference:

The conference will be conducted in a hybrid format, allowing for both in-person and virtual participation. Presenters who are unable to attend on-site will have the opportunity to deliver their presentations and engage with participants remotely through an online platform.

Participation:

There is no registration fee for attending or presenting at the Silicon Valley Peace Conference, and no fee will be charged for publication in the conference proceedings. However, all participants are responsible for covering their own travel, accommodation, and personal expenses. The organizing committee will provide logistical guidance upon request, but is not able to offer financial assistance.

Conference invitations will be extended only to the lead author of each accepted full paper.
