

Updated scoring for SOTIPS for someone in a secure facility with community access

Please use the following guidance when the individual is in a secure facility, such as community corrections or work release.

If someone sleeps in a prison, jail, or community corrections facility but spends some time in the community for work or other activities without a corrections or another staff member "by their side" all the time, then the SOTIPS would consider this person to be "in the community" because they have the opportunity to sexually reoffend. Therefore, score the SOTIPS as if the individual was in the community but apply the following rules on each item below:

Item #6: Criminal and Rule-Breaking Behavior

Count problem behaviors that occur in the community as well as in the facility.

Item #14: Employment

For full time employment take into consideration how many hours they are allowed to work per facility rules.

Item #15: Residence

Score this item based on the last 6 months they were in the community and not living (sleeping) in a secure facility. This item will remain unchanged during the individual's placement.
