Excited About Accelerate Mississippi

The Mississippi Office of Workforce Development was created with the passage of Senate Bill 2564 during the 2020 legislative session. This new agency, now known as Accelerate Mississippi, will serve as the unifying banner and organizational platform designed to propel a unified workforce development strategy and delivery program for Mississippi, improve economic opportunity, and expand workforce training ecosystems to meet current and emerging employment needs. According to Ryan Miller, director of Accelerate, the focus is clear. "Accelerate MS will align our state's educational, training, and economic development initiatives to better position and prepare Mississippi and Mississippians with more diverse, productive, and well-paying employment. We will be active and visible, optimizing existing programs, identifying opportunities for innovation, and expanding workforce training ecosystems across the state as sustainable resources and pathways to skilled employment and support economic growth."

This one stop shop for workforce strategy deployment will be a huge benefit to communities and economic development organizations across the state. Accelerate has direct authority and/or influence over approximately 350 million dollars in workforce funds. One of the many challenges placed before Accelerate is to define strategies that will help improve our state's labor participation rate. Successfully addressing this issue will assist our employers with locating and getting individuals connected to quality jobs.
