

Security Health Plan outlines coverage instructions for commercially purchased monoclonal antibodies

For Security Health Plan Commercial plans, any commercially purchased, FDA approved, monoclonal antibody will be covered subject to the member's cost sharing according to their benefit plan. Commercial plans include individual and family plans (IFP) and small and large employer groups.

For Security Health Plan Medicare Advantage plans, there is no change in coverage for commercially purchased, monoclonal antibodies through the end of the Public Health Emergency (PHE).

To bill for monoclonal antibodies that are commercially purchased, providers should bill their usual and customary charge as the billed amount. This will indicate to Security Health Plan that services should be applied to a member's cost sharing. For monoclonal antibodies that are still federally-funded, providers should bill \$0.00 or \$0.01 as their billed amount to indicate the drug was provided at no cost.
