

Risk adjustment data validation (RADV) audit coming soon

Each year, the Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS) and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) requires Security Health Plan to participate in a risk adjustment data validation (RADV) audit. This year the audit begins in June 2024 for the benefit year 2023.

The audit is a random sample of members enrolled in Affordable Care Act (ACA) compliant individual and small group plans. CMS conducts RADV activities to ensure the accuracy and integrity of risk adjustment data and risk-adjusted payments. The HHS-RADV process verifies that diagnosis codes submitted for payment by an organization are supported by the provider's medical record documentation for an enrollee.

Security Health Plan is responsible for providing CMS with source medical record documentation to validate health plan-submitted medical claims and associated diagnoses for each chosen enrollee.

Soon, we may be contacting your medical records department to request records for Security Health Plan members enrolled in an Affordable Care Act plan. Accompanying the request will be a memo from CMS with more information about the RADV process.
