

## Photo Frame

**What You Need:** Cardboard frame pieces; yarn; scissors; strong tape; hot glue gun; photos of choice

### **What You Do:**

- Give each kid a cardboard piece with a hole cut in the middle (the front of the frame).
- Tell kids to pick a color of yarn and tape the end to the back of the frame. Then they should wrap the yarn around the frame until it is completely covered with yarn. They can change colors at any point; they just need to tape the ends down on the back of the frame.
- *Note: If you're using washi tape, kids can cover the entire surface of the frame front with the tape(s) of their choice.*
- In an area of the room away from the kids, a volunteer will hot glue each kid's frame front to a frame back. They should NOT put glue all the way to the inside edge OR on one of the short ends of the frame, so a photo can slide into the frame.
- Give each kid their frame and a photo of your small group. Help them insert the photo into the frame.
- Hand out "Day 5 Bottom Line Labels," and instruct kids to put them on the back of their frames.

### **What You Say:**

"What did you learn about God this week at VBS? (Pause for responses.) How can you love others this week? (Pause.) Can it be hard to love others? (Pause.) Loving others is important; we all need to be loved. Let's say today's Bottom Line: ***I*Bottom Line! You can LIVE for God by loving others.** When you get home, place your photo frame someplace you can see it and remember your week at Focus VBS and how ***I*Bottom Line! you can LIVE for God by loving others.**"


### **Alternative:**

**What you need:** tissue paper pieces, Mod Podge, paintbrushes

### **What you do:**

- Have kids paint a layer of Mod Podge on one section of the frame. (If they paint the whole frame at once, most of it will dry before they can place the tissue paper on it.)
- Tell kids to place a cut piece of tissue paper over the Mod Podge and press in place.
- Repeat with more pieces, layering on top of each other slightly and covering edges as well as the front of the frame. It's OK to have lots of the original frame showing or to completely cover it.
- Add Mod Podge as needed.
- Once the pattern is complete to their liking, paint a layer of Mod Podge over the entire frame to seal the tissue paper.

Print on thick cardstock and cut out. Provide one for each small group.
