-- Copyrighted material (such as Disney characters) cannot be reprinted in the yearbook without written permission of the company.

-- We are only accepting ads through the online website and not at the school. You may also create your child's message in another program such as Photoshop and upload it to through the online ad creator as a single image. Just be sure that it is still in a jpg format and at least 300 dpi.

Before uploading, select your picture and rename it with your child's first and last name. (Any pictures with descriptions like "baby blue eyes" or "one year old cutie" instead of the official name will not be used.) If you are scanning a print photo, be sure to change your setting to JPG. To avoid mistakes on our part, ONLY SUBMIT ONE PICTURE. Fill in your contact information and select "browse images" to find the picture. Type your son or daughter's name in the first field and "Baby Picture" in the description field.

(For best results, follow the same resolution suggestions above)
