Fafsa & Cal Grant:

FAFSA: The Free Application for Federal Student Aid opens on October 1st! The deadline to submit the FAFSA is March 2nd, but it is advised to submit sooner. Gateway will host a FAFSA Night to assist you in completing the application on Thursday, November 3, from 5:30-7:00.

Cal Grant: The Cal Grant program provides state aid to students enrolled in a California public or private college/university, or California community college. In order access Cal Grant funds, seniors must complete and submit their FAFSA form and High school GPA. Every senior will have their GPA uploaded electronically to Cal Grant, unless parents opt out.

College Applications

University of California's application is now open and the is deadline Nov. 30. Seniors can create their accounts and begin completing their UC applications. Seniors should have their college counselor review their application for correctness and accuracy before they submit. The application fee is \$70 per campus. The California State University application will open on October 1st and the deadline is Nov. 30. Seniors should have their college counselor review their application for correctness and accuracy before they submit. The application fee is \$55 per campus. The CSU Application is link here: http://www.csumentor.edu/AdmissionApp/

Common Application now open. Private schools and common applications schools have various deadlines, some extending into December, January or even February. Please be mindful of these deadlines. We recommend that seniors complete these applications before the end of the first semester so that we can review the application and personal statements before submission. If letters of recommendation are required, students should speak to possible recommenders as soon as possible. We recommend Letters of recommendation be requested at least four weeks ahead of the deadline to give recommenders ample time to write letters.
