Dear Friends,

St. Luke's has much to offer this summer through continued worship, small-group communities, and special events. Building on our work over recent years on expanding our notions of and language for God and God's creations, much of our summer programming has a theme of gender and sexuality. For example:

- In June, St. Luke's will join First Congregational Church to co-host the inaugural Interfaith Family Pride Event.
- July marks the 50th anniversary of women's ordination in the Episcopal Church. For this occasion, we will join St. James Cathedral to present a screening of *The Philadelphia Eleven*. This documentary offers a close look at the journey of the first eleven women to become ordained.
- This year, the Episcopal Church's General Convention delegates will consider adopting expansive language for our standard Eucharistic prayers. In July, the Rev. Greg Millikin will lead us in a two-part conversation on Eucharistic prayer language. Greg is the rector at St. Mark's Evanston and a member of the Church's Standing Commission on Liturgy and Music.

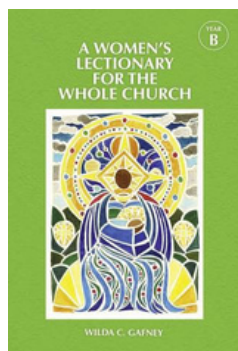

EMBRACING DIVERSITY IN SUMMER LITURGY: WOMEN'S LECTIONARY, INCLUSIVE LANGUAGE, AND LGBTQIA+ VOICES

St. Luke's current strategic plan commits to broadening our use of inclusive language and diversifying our liturgical, musical, and theological resources, with a particular emphasis on persons of color and material published in recent decades. The coming summer months present a great opportunity for St. Luke's to begin this work.



Our liturgy will be centered around *A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church (Year B)* by Wilda Gafney, a widely praised womanist Bible scholar and priest. This resource pairs with the Revised Common Lectionary (Year B). Gafney selects scripture readings that emphasize women's stories. Focusing especially on the Gospel of Mark, *A Women's Lectionary (Year B)* features Gafney's fresh, inclusive, and thought-provoking translations of every reading, alongside commentary on each reading.

We will also incorporate Eucharistic Prayers A and B with trial-approved expansive language, encouraging a broader understanding of God's presence. The Rev. Greg Millikin, rector of St. Mark's Evanston and member of the Episcopal Church's Standing Commission on Liturgy and Music, will guide us in a meaningful discussion about these Eucharistic prayers.

Our summer services will feature preachers who identify as women or LGBTQIA+, further enriching our spiritual experience through diverse perspectives and voices.
