Adoption Social Worker, On-Call Bilingual (English/Spanish)

Position Summary

The On-Call, Bilingual (English/Spanish) Adoption Social Worker will function as a part of the Adoption Agency team within Pact, an Adoption Alliance. Pact's domestic infant adoption program provides child-centered, pro-choice, non-religiously-affiliated adoption services to expectant parents who are considering placing their child for adoption, and to pre-adoptive parents who are hoping to adopt. Because of Pact's mission to serve adopted children of color, the majority of our clients, both expectant parents and pre-adoptive parents, are people of color.

As an Adoption Agency, our priority is to ensure that all expectant parents have true options counseling so as to make the best possible decision for the child; and to ensure that all pre-adoptive parents receive extensive education and preparation to adopt an infant in addition to matching and placement services.

The On-Call Bilingual Adoption Social Worker will function as part of the Adoption Agency team to provide case management services. Their primary clients will be monolingual Spanish-speaking pregnant people, and their partners if involved, who are considering placing their children for adoption and those who have placed their children for adoption. The Adoption Social Worker may be involved in intake, matching, placement and post-placement services, typically meeting with clients at community-based locations.

Skills, Abilities, and Experience

Required

- Master's degree from an accredited graduate school of social work or completion of all work toward a degree except the thesis
- One year prior experience providing case management, social work, and/or mental health services
- Clearance of TB test, fingerprints, and any other mandatory State/Federal licensing or certification requirements
- Fluency (speaking and writing) in both English and Spanish
- Must have access to dependable transportation to attend in-person meetings in the Bay Area. If using personal car, insurance must meet minimum liability requirements
- Ability to work as a team player and with a diverse population

Preferred

- Three years' experience working for adoption agencies (private adoption, foster/ resource family adoption, international adoption) and/or child welfare
- People of color and those touched personally by adoption strongly encouraged to apply



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Essential Tasks

- Provide case management services to monolingual Spanish-speaking pregnant people, and their partners if involved, who are considering placing their children for adoption, and those who have placed their children for adoption
 - Respond in a timely manner to all communications from assigned clients
 - In collaboration with the Adoption Agency Supervisor and/or Adoption Social Worker, conduct a minimum of one outreach visit / month to organizations primarily serving monolingual Spanish-speaking populations
 - Occasionally provide coverage for last-minute placements and adoptions, including meeting with clients in the field, at a hospital, etc.
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Schedule

- The ideal candidate will commit to a minimum of one year
- This will be an on-call position, with a guarantee of four hours initial training in the first month and two hours per month ongoing, with the potential for additional hours
- The guaranteed two hours / month to be scheduled at a time that is mutually convenient for the employee and the organization
- Work hours will typically be during the daytime with occasional evenings and weekends
- During an adoption placement, work hours may be longer and unpredictable

Communication

- Communicates clearly and effectively, both verbally and in writing, with co-workers, supervisor, and clients
- Prepares clearly and concisely written reports and summaries by deadline
- Must be able to comprehend, follow, and clearly convey instructions to others
- Must be computer proficient

Physical Demands

- Must be able to travel to locations around the Bay Area to meet with clients in person
 - Must be able to bend and lift as much as 25 pounds
 - Must be able to operate office equipment requiring repetitive hand movement and fine coordination including use of a computer keyboard
 - The physical demands and work environment described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job.
 - Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals to perform the essential functions
 - The noise level in the work environment is usually quiet and, at all times, maintained within safe California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (CAL/OSHA) standards.

- Hourly pay \$30-\$40 dependent on experience.
