#### **National Merit Semifinalists** [Top ½ of 1% of all junior students taking the PSAT]

National Merit Semifinalists are the highest scoring participants in each state, representing about ½% of the state's juniors taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT). About 16,000 Semifinalists are named each year. Students who are recognized publicly as Semifinalists in the National Merit Scholarship Program have an opportunity to advance in the scholarship competition by qualifying as Finalists. Only Finalists are considered for Merit Scholarships, totaling more than \$34 million.
