- Develop relevant skills such as understanding the role of a trustee, cultivating and soliciting funds, recruiting new board members and other volunteers, reading and understanding financial statements, et al.
- Represent Kadima on both an informal and formal basis to the broader community.
 As a school representative, you are implicitly a recruiter for new talent and leadership.
- Financially support Board fundraising events, and when able, to identify new fundraising resources.
- Understand that the Head of School reports to the President of the Board and interacts with the Board
- Work in partnership with staff to fulfill our mission and ensure the smooth functioning of the school.
- The Board sets the policies, but the day-to-day- operations and implementation of policy is the sole responsibility of the Head of School and his/her faculty and staff.
- Maintain a positive attitude that contributes to the Board's morale and sense of unity, and helps each board member to feel that s/he is a part of a spirited and purposeful group.
- Display honesty, sensitivity, tolerance of differing views, personal integrity, sense of values, concern for Kadima's development and a sense of humor.
