For the last five years, NFFE has worked with unionists of all ages, backgrounds, and experience levels to cultivate its young worker initiative. In that time, NFFE's Young Federal Leaders (YFL) program has grown to include educational, leadership, and mentorship opportunities for its participants. While the program has achieved a great deal of success in a short time, it has also encountered hurdles that have challenged our young worker program in unexpected ways.
