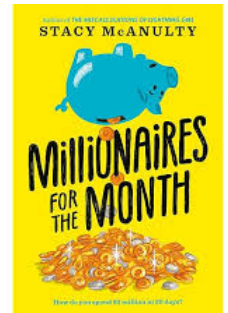
6th-Grade Summer Reading Requirements

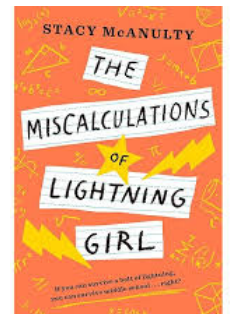
