What is the purpose of the survey?

The aim of this survey is to assess the perceptions of service providers about the needs (both met and unmet), the services and community supports available for children exposed to domestic violence and for survivors of domestic violence who are parents of children under age 18 years old in Texas, especially during this Coronavirus Pandemic.

Am I eligible to participate?

You are eligible to take this survey if you are 18 or older and you are a professional staff member, or service provider who works in Texas with survivors of child abuse, domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking and/or children who have been exposed to domestic violence.

What will the survey be like?

If you agree to take part in this study, you will be asked to participate in a survey. If you agree to participate in this study, you will be asked questions related to:

- Your role in your organization and some basic information about your organization
- Your perceptions of the available services and supports in your community
- Occupational stress
- Capacity of services and needs (both met and unmet)
- Recommendations
- Your demographics (age, gender, race, ethnicity)

The survey will take about 30 minutes of your time. All questions are optional and can be skipped.

Taking part in this research study is voluntary and anonymous. You do not have to participate, and you can stop at any time.
