

There's a lot of confusion about the federal eviction moratorium that's now in place and what's expected of tenants. What we know right now, is that for tenants to qualify for protection under the federal government's moratorium, a tenant must apply for all available financial assistance and complete a declaration notice. Both the financial assistance application form and the federal declaration form are available online at www.haconcapecod.org.

We need your help getting the word out to renters in need of assistance. We urge residents to contact Housing Assistance today to apply for financial assistance to bring their past-due rent up to date. Please share the attached flyer with your members, clients and networks, in your newsletter, and on social media. Now more than ever, we all need a safe place to call home.

The guidance from the Governor's office and related eviction diversion programs are evolving and Housing Assistance is involved in regular conversations with the state about setting up these processes. Regardless of how these new programs develop, if tenants have had a loss of income or increase in expenses due to COVID Housing Assistance Corporation can help tenants obtain financial assistance **today** to help them pay the rent they owe. Our agency has access to federal, state, county, and local financial assistance. **It is important for renters to understand the moratorium does not eliminate any obligation to pay rent. It only prevents immediate removal. All rent is still due.**
