




Q3 Which of the following has your municipality implemented to help control the spread of the pandemic? (Choose all that apply)






Q7 Reflecting on the state of planning/preparation in your municipality, how would you rate each of the following?



Q9 Do you expect that your municipality will take any of the following actions in response to the economic and fiscal impacts of COVID-19 in the next six months? (Choose all that apply)



Q10 How would you rate your municipality's level of coordination with each of the following organizations?



Q11 How would you rate the job your STATE government has done regarding the following?




Q12 How would you rate the job the FEDERAL government (HHS/CDC/FEMA) has done related to the following?








