Sunday, October 29: Enchanted Walk: A Halloween-time event for K through 2nd grade families.


Thursday, November 9: Lantern Walk: A seasonal festival for K through 2nd grade families.

A PEEK INTO THE CLASSROOM:

From Ms. Loshak: Second Grade has come back to school with strength and courage to go forth as we grapple with our dragons and find our inner light radiating forth. We begin the year with our Michaelmas play, which we look forward to sharing with the whole community!



From Ms. Gill: The Sixth Grade has started off the year by casting our sights downward to the earth. Rocks and minerals have captivated our imagination, and it has been a mind-expanding challenge to imagine that our mountainous landscape was pushed about by mile-high ice sheets. Just like our animal block in Fourth Grade, and our botany block in Fifth Grade, geology reveals truthful signs of the cycles within creation. This year, we will explore the stone formed within the darkness of caves, and we hope to show the light within the mineral world in our paintings. Many stories will be told of human experiences shaped by the complex and often overlooked formation of good old rocks. Next month, when the leaves begin to turn fiery and bright, our class will move on towards the founding of Rome.

CHORUS NEWS

Some parents have probably been told by your children of the changes in the choruses this year at Mountain Laurel. This change is something that the Music Group has wanted to do for a long time. I spent the last 2 years researching and speaking to Waldorf and public school chorus teachers. All agreed that middle school chorus is one of the most difficult classes to hold. There was only one Waldorf School out of seven schools that I spoke to that combines 6th, 7th, and 8th grade into one chorus. There were no public school chorus teachers who I spoke to at a chorus workshop I attended this summer that combines the 6th, 7th, and 8th grades. Teachers say that pedagogically, the difference between 6th and 8th can be, and is often, oceans apart. This year it is plain to see how far apart the 6th and 8th graders are developmentally. After presenting the idea of pulling the 6th graders out of the middle school chorus to the College, we decided the best way to do this would be to combine 5th and 6th graders together into a chorus and leave the 7th and 8th graders in their own chorus. The 4th grade would have their own chorus as well. One thing I already know about the new arrangement for this year: the 5th and 6th graders belong together. And the 4th grade is really comfortable singing together as a class. The 7th and 8th grade chorus is another story, unique unto itself.
