Tired of Fishing in the heat? Get ready for Fall Fishing!

Some of the best fall fishing in the Country is located in the St. Lawrence River Valley area. Lakes, rivers, and ponds are among the various popular fishing spots including; Black Lake, Cranberry Lake, Grasse River, Oswegatchie River, Norwood Pond, Tooley Pond and many more!



Fish are extremely fickle in the fall so slow your bait and lures



Look for warmer waters. Fish will gravitate towards water warmed by the sun



Experiment with different baits to see which one works best

Anglers are encouraged to release ALL Muskellunge taken from St. Lawrence County waters. For other species, anglers are encouraged to practice selective harvest. This practice calls upon anglers to release the larger fish of any species and to keep smaller ones for eating.

Catch & Release, Selective Harvest:

- Avoid over fighting the fish so that it doesn't become stressed.
- If possible, unhook the fish in the water.
- Carry needle nose pliers and other unhooking tools to facilitate getting the hook out.
- If a photo is to be taken, have the camera ready before removing the fish from the water.
- Hold the fish by its tail, support the midsection with other hand until the fish swims off on its own.
