

2023 BR Health and Wellness Screening Policies and Procedures

We will continue to update these policies and procedures to reflect the current best practices recommended by public health authorities.

Most Recently Updated 4/6/2023

General Highlights:

- Please do not plan to attend large gatherings the week before arriving at camp. Family members who live at home or have close contact with your camper should also avoid exposure before arrival.
- All campers, regardless of vaccination status, will be required to test for COVID-19 before they arrive at camp.
- All campers traveling by plane to camp should wear a mask while traveling.
- **All families must be available, or have a plan in place, to pick up a camper within 24 hours of a positive COVID-19 test, injury that would require recovery, or contagious illness that would require over 48 hours of quarantine.**

Camper and Health Screenings:

- Pre- Camp Screening:
 - We ask that campers limit their exposure to others and are extremely cautious while in social environments the week before arrival. Please monitor your camper's symptoms and wellness before you arrive.
- Arrival Screening:
 - We will have a symptom and temperature check upon arrival. Any camper with a temperature over 100.4 degrees will not be allowed to check into camp and will need to be fever free for 24 hours (without the use of medication) prior to returning to camp.
 - Campers will be required to test for COVID-19 the morning of arrival. Please test your camper at home the morning of check-in. We will be confirming test results during the health screening at check-in.
 - We will have tests available should you forget to take one before you come to camp.
- On-Going Screenings:
 - Symptomatic campers will be tested and quarantined until results are available.

Testing at Camp:

- We will only test campers if they are symptomatic.
- If there is a specific type of test you would like your child to use, should we need to test them while at camp, please send them with 3 test kits in a bag with their name on it. These will be turned in during the health screening at check-in and returned to your camper at the end of the session.

In the event a positive case of COVID-19:

- All families must be available, or have a plan in place, to pick up a camper within 24 hours of positive COVID-19 test result.
- Campers who test positive before or during camp will be able to return to camp after a 5-day quarantine, as recommended by the CDC and American Camping Association, along with a negative COVID-19 rapid test result. These recommendations are constantly being updated therefore we will update with details closer to summer.
- We will notify all families via email if there was a positive case of COVID-19 at camp during your camper's session.
