## **Message for Students and other Travelers**

**Course:** CHST 2425 World of the Bible

**When:** Spring 2018 with Dr. Wilbanks

**Israel Trip Dates:** Tuesday, May 1, 2018 - Friday, May 11, 2018

As a student enrolled in the course, you are responsible for paying the travel cost of **\$3358** to the university. This is over and above your regular university tuition and **covers: medical trip insurance (\$40) and love offering to guide and driver (\$72)**. The university will in turn pay JCBS/EO. As a student enrolled in the course, the travel cost is eligible to be covered by student loans (please confer with Mr. Michael Jordan in Financial Aid). Non-students who wish to take the course need to see Dr. Wilbanks.

• You can take the trip without taking the course (current students, recent alumni, and soon to be alumni). If so, pay your money directly to JCBS/EO Tours. In this case, no scholarships or grants can cover the amount of travel.

- Parents, family members, and friends, etc. are welcome, and we encourage them to travel with us. We DO require them to purchase medical insurance for the trip for a nominal additional cost (probably between \$30-\$40, subject to change). These travelers will pay this premium to NGU, and NGU will pay the insurance company.
- The NGU code of conduct regarding behavior, speech, alcohol, and tobacco will necessarily be a part of this trip for all participants.
- **All travelers must sign a release form as provided by the university.**



## **May 1 and 2 Day 1 and Day 2 Tuesday and Wednesday**

### **Depart the USA for the Holy Land**

Your spiritual pilgrimage begins as you depart the USA on an overnight flight. You will be welcomed to the Holy Land by our representative. Time permitting; travel to Mt. Carmel where Elijah defeated the prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18:19-40) and enjoy the view of Haifa and the Mediterranean. Overnight in Galilee.

## **May 3 Day 3 Thursday**

### **Field Trip: Hazor, Huleh Valley, Dan, Banyas Waterfall, View of Mt. Hermon, Golan Heights, Kuneitra**

Explore Hazor, one of the oldest archaeological sites in Israel. Here, Joshua fought against Jabin (Josh. 11: 1-11). Hazor was later fortified by Solomon. At nearby Tel Dan, see the mud brick arch constructed in pre-Israelite (Canaanites) times and where The House of David fragment from the First Temple Period was discovered. Visit Caesarea Philippi, where Jesus traveled with His disciples and where nearby Peter made his great confession to Jesus, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matt. 16: 16). See the Banyas spring, which is the source of the Hermon River and the waterfall. Continue on to Mount Hermon, probably the site of the Lord's Transfiguration (Matt. 17: 1-9). Visit Nimrod's Fortress that graces the slopes of Israel's highest mountain. The fortress overlooks the forested dales and magnificent landscape of the area. Travel on through the Golan Heights and view Kuneitra and the road to Damascus. Overnight in Galilee.

## **May 4 Day 4 Friday**

### **Field Trip: Shefaram, Nazareth, Nazareth Village, Samaria, Jacob's Well, Mt. Gerizim**

Journey to Shefaram to visit a local community. Continue to Nazareth, Jesus' boyhood home (Matthew 2: 23). See Mary's Well and the Church of the Annunciation. Tour the Nazareth Village, a recreation of the first century Galilean Village. Travel to Samaria to visit Jacob's Well, where Jesus encountered the Samaritan woman (John 4). Visit Mt. Gerizim near the Biblical city of Shechem, which is now modern Nablus. Overnight in Galilee.

## **May 5 Day 5 Saturday**

### **Field Trip: Mt. Arbel and the Sea of Galilee**

Travel to Mt. Arbel and walk along its peak for a stunning view of the Sea of Galilee and the area in which Jesus ministered, with extended views of Mt. Hermon in the north and Mt. Tabor in the south. Visit kibbutz Nof Ginnosar, where you'll learn about the "Ancient Boat", a rare example of the kind of boat in which Jesus would have sailed. Visit the ancient town of Magdala and explore the recent excavations. With Bible in hand, cross the waters of the Sea of Galilee and participate in a special onboard worship service. Travel to the Mt. of Beatitudes where Jesus preached to the people (Matt. 5-7). At Tabgha, the traditional location for the calling of the disciples and the feeding of the 5000, visit the Church of the Fish and the Loaves (Luke 9:10-17). Visit the Chapel of the Primacy, where three times Peter professed his devotion to the risen Christ (John 21). Travel to Capernaum, the center of Jesus' ministry in the Galilee. Visit the synagogue, which stands on the site where Jesus taught. Recall his teaching and preaching the gospel of the kingdom (Matt. 4: 13, 23). Not far away is Bethsaida, where Jesus chose five of his disciples (Matt. 4:18-21; John 1:39-51). Continue to





Kursi, which was the region of the Gadarenes in Christ's time, and remember where Christ cast demons into the swine (Mark 5). At the River Jordan you can remember your baptism at the Yardenit Baptismal Site. Overnight in Galilee.

#### **May 6 Day 6 Sunday**

##### **Field Trip: Beit Shean, Megiddo, Caesarea-by-the-Sea, Abu Gosh**

Visit the ruins of Beit Shean, which was continuously inhabited for 5000 years and was one of the Roman cities Jesus passed on his way from Galilee to Jerusalem. Visit Ein Harod (Judg. 7:1), the spring where Gideon gathered his men to fight the Midianites. Travel the ancient caravan route to Tel Megiddo where 20 different cities lie superimposed upon each other. Near Tel Megiddo, the Valley of Jezreel is a possible location of the last great war, the Battle of Armageddon. Time permitting; you'll see other sites of interest in the Jezreel Valley, also known as the Valley of Esdraelon and the "breadbasket of Israel." Visit the Roman Aqueduct and Theatre at Caesarea, a center of the early Christians. Here, Cornelius became the first Gentile convert to the new religion (Acts 10) and Paul was imprisoned before being taken to Rome for Trial. On your way to Jerusalem, visit Abu Gosh, one of the places where Jesus revealed himself after the Resurrection to his disciples. Overnight in Jerusalem.

#### **May 7 Day 7 Monday**

##### **Field Trip: Jerusalem**

Stand atop the Mount of Olives as Jesus did and enjoy a remarkable view of the "Golden City" of Jerusalem, including the Temple Mount and Dome of the Rock. Forty days after his resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven from the Mount of Olives (Acts 1: 9 - 12). Visit the Chapel of the Ascension. Pray in the Garden of Gethsemane as Jesus prayed (Matt. 26: 36 - 44). On Mount Zion visit the House of the High Priest Caiaphas, where Jesus was imprisoned for a night (Matt. 26: 57 - 65) and the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu. Stand in the Upper Room, revered as the place of the Last Supper (Mark 14: 12 - 26). Visit the Southern Wall Excavations of the Temple including the Teaching Steps and the Western Wall. Visit the Rabbi's Tunnel. Overnight in Jerusalem.

#### **May 8 Day 8 Tuesday**

##### **Field Trip: Jericho, Qumran, Masada, Ein Gedi, Dead Sea**

Travel to Jericho and visit the ruins of the ancient city, which was conquered by Joshua (Josh. 6: 1, 2, 20). From Jericho, ride a cable car to the traditional site of the Mount of Temptation of Jesus (Matt. 4: 1-11). Even today, the road from Jericho to Jerusalem twists for miles as it climbs from below sea level into the Judean Mountains. Jesus traveled the nearby Roman road, the setting of His parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10: 30-36). Travel to Qumran, site of the Dead Sea Scroll discovery, to discuss the mysterious community of Essenes who once lived on the shores of the Dead Sea. Visit Masada, Herod's mountaintop fortress, which became the last stronghold of the Jewish Rebellion against the Romans. Ride the cable car to the top to explore. Peer down upon the remains of the Roman camps and siege ramp below. Visit Ein Gedi, where David sought refuge from Saul. Time permitting; stop briefly at the shores of the Dead Sea for a quick dip in the salt and mineral laden waters. Overnight in Bethlehem.

#### **May 9 Day 9 Wednesday**

##### **Field Trip: Bethlehem, Jerusalem, the Old City**

In Bethlehem, visit the cave where Jesus was born and the church, which had been constructed on the site (Matt. 1: 18-25; Luke 2: 1-7). Nearby, view the Shepherds' Field, where the Good News was first heard. Cross into Jerusalem and view the Pool of Bethesda (John 5: 1-31), where Jesus

performed the Sabbath miracle. Visit the Temple Mount. Visit Herod's Antonia Fortress, where Jesus was brought before Pontius Pilate (Luke 23: 1 - 11). Walk the Via Dolorosa, "the Way of the Cross", and visit the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Visit and worship at the Garden Tomb and experience the reality of the Resurrection. Overnight in Bethlehem.

#### **May 10 Day 10 Thursday**

##### **Field Trip: Israel Museum, Emmaus Road, Mareshah, Lachish, Beersheba**

Visit the Israel Museum, where you will see the Model of the First century Jerusalem and the fragments of the Dead Sea Scrolls. Journey through the Valley of Elah, where David defeated Goliath (I Samuel 17). Walk the Emmaus Road, where Jesus appeared to two travelers on the evening of the Resurrection. Visit Mareshah and the caves, which housed homes, baths and water cisterns during the Maccabean times. Drive by Lachish, a city, which dates back to over 2000 years before Christ. Captured by both Joshua and fortified by Rehoboam, it was one of the principal cities of Judah. One of its conquerors, Sennacherib, destroyed Lachish (II Kings 18: 13-17) and memorialized the victory in reliefs on the walls of his palace in Ninevah. Time permitting; travel to the ancient town of Beersheba, the home of Abraham (Gen. 22:19), which is the southernmost point in the land of Judah. Depending on the flight schedule, the group will either overnight in Jerusalem or transfer to the airport after dinner for a late evening flight home. (This information will not be available until a couple of weeks before you depart.).
