Welcome to Lutheran Church of the Foothills

We are grateful to have you joining us in worship today. Please note the following information so that your time with us is spiritually uplifting and comfortable.

Holy Communion: All are welcome to receive the Lord's Supper. You do not need to be a member of Lutheran Church of Foothills or any other church to have a place at the Lord's table. There is no age requirement. It is God's table, not ours, and all are invited. If you are spiritually hungry, come and be fed.

How to Commune: At the ushers' invitation, come up the center aisle to the Pastor and hold your hands out to receive the host (wafer). After placing the host in your mouth, you may pick up an individual cup of red wine or white grape juice to drink. Gluten free wafers are available upon request. After you drink the cup, place your empty cup in the lined basket before returning via the side aisle to your seat. If you prefer to remain seated, please indicate this to the usher and communion will be brought you.

Offering: Thank you for your continued support of the mission and ministry of Lutheran Church of the Foothills. You can place your offering in the basket in the back of the center aisle before service begins, give online at our website, or scan the QR code found in the worship liturgy. "Sunday Dollars," loose dollars placed in the basket, are automatically designated for our current month's Community Service emphasis.

Recordings: This service is being recorded and live streamed.

Pray-Ground: We enjoy having our children in worship, and we delight in their ability to see and experience all that is happening in the worship space. We invite you to sit anywhere you are comfortable. There is a special place in the front, pulpit side of the sanctuary designated the Pray-Ground, where children can worship, wiggle, play, color, learn and grow as part of our faith community. Adults are encouraged to sit where children can see them when they are using the Pray-Ground, in case they need assistance.

Restrooms: Restrooms are located down the east hallway between the activities room and the front entrance of the building. These restrooms are handicap accessible and each contains a changing table. There is a gender neutral facility in the Learning Center, located at the end of the west hallway past the church offices.

Hearing Assistance: Please switch to a T-coil setting on your hearing aids to take advantage of the induction loop. The ushers can provide you with headphones to wear during the service if you so desire.

Large Print Bulletins: If you desire a large print bulletin, please request one from the ushers as you enter the worship space.

After supper, he took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, “Drink this, all of you; this is my blood, poured out for you and for everyone. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me.”

May these gifts of bread and wine indeed be signs and substance for us of your presence within us and throughout creation, and may they strengthen us to live with power and compassion in the assurance of your blessing.

With volunteers and community Co-Sponsor Teams, The Immigration and Refugee Services branch of LSS-SW builds self-reliant foundations for approximately 400 refugees each year. Their services include housing, case management, navigating life in a different culture, employment support, K-12 education services, a youth mentor program, and more. About “A New Creed”

“A New Creed” is an affirmation of faith used widely in the worship services of the United Church of Canada. It was originally adopted in 1968 by the 23rd General Council. Originally known as “A Contemporary Expression of Christian Faith,” it began with the line “Man is not alone.” It was amended in 1980 to make its language inclusive, and again in 1994 to add the words “to live with respect in Creation.”

The creed is not meant to replace the ancient Apostles’ Creed or the Nicene Creed, but to act as a supplement to these statements of faith.
