1. Using a pencil, outline a large bubble version of the name or word you'd like to word illustrate.
2. Using several different marker colors, begin alternating them to write different descriptive words that describe your pencil outlined word.
3. Vary the size and lettering type to make the picture more fun and interesting.
4. Use descriptive words until you've filled all of your pencil outlined bubble letters.

(Below I've added a picture of a project I did for some of our youth a few years ago. Instead of a word, I filled each of their enneagram numbers with characteristics that described them. But this is what you're going for!)
