## A Letter From Pastor Matthew

People of God at Holy Love,

I wish that I could be with you to celebrate the gift of Resurrection. I trust, though, that the Risen Christ will show up at Holy Love even if I can't – and I trust that Christ will show up where I'll be, even though I can't be with y'all.

Your support, cards, messages and prayers mean a great deal to me. I know many people have wondered about visiting. I very much appreciate your interest in supporting me in that way; however, at this time, I am not receiving visitors other than immediate family. As it turns out, recovering from a significant injury is a lot of work; keeping the visitors list short will give me plenty of energy to keep my focus there.

Speaking of recovery, I wanted to let you know I'm making great progress in physical rehabilitation. Doctors have told us that there's no way to really know the extent of recovery that's possible following a Spinal Cord Injury. But the staff at Craig Hospital is probably the best in the nation, and they continue to take good care of me.

In fact, most of the staff who works with me regularly says that my physical capability and function continues to improve; it seems like almost daily I'm capable of something new. Don't put it on your bucket-list, but in-patient rehab has been a life-giving experience and I'm grateful for the training program, and for the dedicated staff who are guiding my recovery.

Speaking of rehab, the doctors and other staff expect that my rehab program will take several more months, and will likely be in a couple different facilities. As such, it's too soon to predict my timing to return to work, or my physical ability when I am able to return – but it looks like I'll be focused on rehabilitation, and consequently unable to return to serving as your pastor until at least the end of the summer.

Again, thank you for the prayers and thoughts and cards and big butcher-paper Sunday School artwork – those things have decorated my room since I received them, and I love seeing them and being reminded of you. And thanks for the ministry you continue to participate in there as a part of the fantastic Body of Christ at Holy Love.






## Rainbow Trail Summer Camps

A few years ago when my wife and I owned our own business there was a time when we were searching for another employee. We had a “*help wanted*” sign posted, but as I was traveling down Speer Boulevard I saw a man standing on the corner near Broadway holding a sign that read “**Will work for food.**” My first impression was “*Oh my gosh, there is another one of those homeless folks.*” But for some reason I stopped and asked him, “*do you want a job?.*” and his reply was “*Yes, please.*” I then told him to gather up his stuff and get in my company van of which he then went under the Broadway Bridge and picked up a tent and some of his stuff that was in one

of those grocery carts which some homeless people use and returned to my company van. I was a little hesitant doing this, but soon felt comfortable taking him to a motel to get a room and then purchasing some clean clothes and shaving equipment. I then told him that “*I needed him and I hoped that he needed me*”.

For the next several years this homeless man worked for our company and was a very good and dedicated employee. I was so pleased that we had met and was thankful that God had brought us together.

After a few years my wife and I sold our company and retired thanks to the good work our employees had done and making our company very successful. About 10 years after retiring, I was in a store when all of a sudden this man came running up to me, gave me a big hug and said, “*Do you remember me?*” Of course I remembered him as we both grinned with astonishment. He then said “*do you know what I do now?*” as he handed me his business card. He went on to tell me that he had his own condo and a wonderful wife. As I looked at his business card, it gave me a chill as I read his name and his title, “**pastor**”. The card went on to read, “**GOD'S WORD—Matt 6:33 Do what God wants first.**” The card gave his name, his church name and a church address in Lakewood followed by the words, “**Bringing GOD'S Word to You. Bible study, counseling and full services.**” Whoa, what a wonderful feeling I had as I tried to keep the tears back.

You never know what life will bring, but what is important is to know that God is in control and our life experiences bring us many gifts. This homeless man was a gift that our company needed and in turn he needed us as he went on to share his life in a humble and meaningful way.
