2. Special Events to Invite

- Annual prospect dinner (informative only--no pressure to join!)
 - Challenge: must be of interest to current Serrans so prospects see the Club in its best light/high membership turnout
- Inviting prospects to Club events involving the Bishop
 - Lay Catholics like to rub shoulders with their Bishop!
 - Option: using most popular events to inform, recruit
- Ask the Bishop & Vocations Director to regularly suggest Serra membership as a way for Lay Catholics to actively participate in the Diocese's vocation efforts!

- Be Excited, Joyful when talking about Serra

- Cost: \$____ per month and what is accomplished by dues
- Not about what you get out of it, but what you give

Be Prepared for Objections

- ***"I can pray for vocations without being in Serra"***
 - Serra is more than just prayer—it is the action prayer calls us to. E.g., service to Vocations office, affirmation of religious and support of priests/ religious/seminarians
 - Serra group prayers offer more quality, quantity, continuity & effectiveness for vocations
- ***"Dues seem too high"***
 - \$____/month (and examples of what they accomplish)
- ***"Not sure with the Priest Abuse Scandal and all"***
 - Never been more important to affirm and support the many good priests and religious unfairly tarred by the scandal.

4. The *Application Form* (p. 5A-C)

- Form is confusing to prospects
- Do NOT hand out blank to prospects
- Pre-fill: Club Name, Number and District No.
– (copy for general use by club members)
- Pre-fill: sponsor's name with signature
- Pre-fill: priest's signature (?)
- Identify required fields for prospect to fill in with checkmark or highlighting
- Include self-addressed, stamped envelope to Treasurer & follow up to make sure it is received.

**Membership
Initiation Fee \$11.75**

- Many clubs have gotten out of the habit of paying the initiation fee (formerly \$15) and hold applications until the next regular billing cycle
- This delays the applicant from immediately receiving communications from Serra US and Serra Intl.
- The new Initiation fee covers all dues until the next regular invoice cycle (no matter when they join)
- Includes a kit including a new member pin, handbook & certificate
- Paid by prospect to Club then Club pays Serra

- Lets new members know they are really joining something
- Involve Bishop/Vocations Director/Chaplain if possible
- Great place to deliver new member kit with Serra pin
- Ceremony as part of or following Mass

- Don't hold up for anything except upcoming events
- Hard copy mailed to homes recommended at least once a quarter
- Consider obituaries of deceased members
- Include board minutes

Serran Pam Ratigan [1943-2017] is known to many for her tireless work as a volunteer in the Council Bluffs community. She certainly helped St. Patrick's Church, attending daily Mass, assisting as a lector and Eucharistic minister as needed, helping with the desserts for the St. Patrick's Festival in March, working the Rummage Sale in May and October. Once a month on Monday evening, she participated in Catholic Daughters, giving a ride to one who needed a lift. Once a month on Tuesdays she could be seen at the Phoenix House, a shelter and advocacy center for those enduring domestic abuse and or sexual violence. Pam helped with their recycling of paper, glass, and cans just as she did in the church hall at St. Patrick's. I think of her as the Recycling Queen. She not only procured the bins in the church hall for the recyclables, loaded her car with the materials when the bins were full, and delivered it to local recycling centers, she also dumpster-dived on occasion to retrieve earthly resources that could be reused. She sang with the Memorial Choir at funerals and helped with funeral dinners served in the parish hall. Every Wednesday morning, she joined the Sewing and Craft group, making lap, baby, and bed-size quilts that were donated to nursing homes, Birthright, Gabriel's Corner, Children's Square, MOHM's [Messengers of Hope Ministries], veterans.

Nursing was her career. Being present for important life events of her children and grandchildren was another passion. Her desire for "efficient economy" led to a decision to have both knees replaced at the same time so as to incur only one anesthesia, one recovery, one hospitalization, and one rehabilitation period. That seems like true grit. She traveled far distances to be with family, going to Japan to be with her son and his family. She helped aging persons with daily tasks.

The above are just a few of the many things she did to make life worth living for herself and others. Her example continues to inspire others to make good use of our time on earth and good use of the earth's resources with gratitude for what we enjoy and hope of renewing all that we can for future generations. God Bless Pam as she has blessed us. May light perpetual shine upon her.

25 Years Ago - 1995

- A garage sale was advertised for August at the Feyereisen home.
- Our Chaplain, Fr. James Burns gathered vocation narratives from priests and religious for a booklet which we titled "Who Me?"
- President's Message by LeRoy Piché included information on the Serra International Convention in Genoa, Italy, attended by eight of our club members.

He wrote, "the important message we all experienced was the commonality of our goals as Serrans...as the convention concluded, we went to Rome for an audience with the Holy Father (JP II). His words were of encouragement and appreciation for the work of Serra. His admonition to us was,

'Prove to everyone, with clarity and without compromise, your sincere adherence to Christ. Prove at home, at work, in your associations, that the message of Jesus forms real men and women, capable of coping serenely with the harshness of daily life. Be available to contribute with all your strength to the construction of a civil society more worthy of man. Prove in your behavior that, with the grace of God, it is possible to put into practice in the modern world the "Sermon on the Mount" and the "Beatitudes", with all the radicalism they involve.'

LeRoy concluded by writing, "Maybe we should revisit those words every now and then with a

prayer that the Holy Spirit guide our resolve 'to be available and contribute to a more worthy society.' The Serran movement can be the instrument."

- Seminary Visits Program - Roger Carr, vocations vice president, along with Serra Chaplain, Fr. James Burns, and George Merriam met with Fr. John Ubel, co-director of the Vocations Office for the Archdiocese. Fr. Ubel expressed a desire to change the format of our seminary visits to put the emphasis on vocations. Also, the recommendation was explored to have the young women visit with sisters from local religious orders while the young men visit with priests and brothers at the seminary.

15 Years Ago - 2005

Our "Walk With Me Novice" made her First Profession of Vows on the Feast of the Transfiguration, August 6, 2005 at St. Agnes Church. Sr. Maria Stella Whittier received her new habit, scapular, and veil as she made vows with Sisters in Jesus the Lord. She is living her vocational call in Russia. The Handmaids: Fostering Religious Vocations

A special program featuring Sr. Anna Mary Swanson of the Handmaids of the Sacred Heart of Jesus was our bonus after-Mass gift on the July 1 Feast of St. Junipero Serra. Deacon Steven Koop of the St. Paul Serra Club arranged for the presentation on "How the 'Handmaids' Foster Women's Religious Vocations."

After introducing Sister Veronica and Sister Cecilia who accompanied her, Sister Anna Mary spoke about the charism of the Handmaids, a relatively new order of vibrant young women who are attracting new members to consecrated life and service to the Church. She shared the wonderful information that they will be opening a house in Hopkins in our Archdiocese. The New Ulm Diocese is home to their Motherhouse. The Handmaids also have a group of sisters serving in the Duluth Diocese.

Sister Anna Mary indicated that lovingly and faithfully living their vocation is one of the best ways to encourage new religious vocations. She also indicated that the opportunity to visit with young women is not about recruitment, but rather about seeking a normal, natural relationship where there can be an exchange of faith and interests and opportunity to dispel fears of a new and changed way of life. In the end, vocations are a gift from God, so helping young women learn to pray is paramount.

Sister ended her presentation with a quote from Pope Benedict who addressed a question of declining vocations when he visited the United States in 2008: "To the extent that we teach young people to pray, and to pray well, we will be cooperating with God's call. Programs, plans and projects have their place; but the discernment of a vocation is above all the fruit of an intimate dialogue between the Lord and His disciples. Young people, if they know how to pray, can be

trusted to know what to do with God's call."

After hearing Sister's presentation, my "take" is that we Serrans need to continue on our knees and on our beads trusting that God is hearing our plea, our prayers and our willingness to walk with men and women as they discern God's call. The absence of programs/projects during this "Covid climate" gives us all more time to concentrate on our No. 1 priority — prayer!

In Memoriam: Fr. Kunnel

Reverend Mathai Thomas Kunnel, 60, passed from this earthly life to eternal rest on June 24, 2020. A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated June 29, 2020 at St. Ambrose Cathedral in Des Moines.

Fr. Tom was born in Kottayam, India, one of seven children. At the age of 15, Fr. Tom traveled 4,000 miles to Ranchi, India to enter the seminary. He was ordained a priest of the Third Order Regular of Saint Francis, Province of India, in 1988. Father Tom served in six areas throughout India. He gave retreats for Saint Teresa of Calcutta and her Missionary of Charity community.

In December 2001, the Superior of his religious community sent Father Kunnel to the United States to serve as a missionary in the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis. He served three parish communities between 2002 and 2011: Parochial Vicar at Epiphany, Coon Rapids and St. John the Baptist, New Brighton and Pastor of Immaculate Conception in Columbia Heights. Soon after his arrival in the Twin Cities, he met Bishop Richard Pates, then an Auxiliary Bishop in the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. Their friendship would eventually lead Father Tom to the Diocese of Des Moines in 2011.

Father Tom will be remembered for his courageous and joyful spirit, as well as for the support and friendship he provided to many and for the absolute dedication that he gave to his priesthood and people of God. *Information from his obituary in the Des Moines Register.*

The Sisters of St. Francis of Dubuque were founded by Mother Xavier Termehr in 1864 in Herford, Germany, where the needs of many homeless and hungry children touched her heart and conscience. Here she and her sisters staffed an orphanage and nursed the elderly who were homebound. The Sisters also ministered as nurses on the battlefields of the Austro-Prussian and Franco-Prussian Wars.



In 1875 a new law ordered religious communities not involved in hospital work to either disband or emigrate. At that time, we were a community of 29 members and each one desired to remain a religious community, even though this meant exile from their native land. Fortunately, a priest from Iowa who had visited the sisters invited them to Iowa City. We arrived September 8, 1875. Here we established an orphanage and nursed the sick. In 1878 Bishop Hennessy invited us to Dubuque to open a German Catholic orphanage. Mother Xavier and her sisters responded to this need by moving our community to Dubuque. Once we became proficient in speaking English our services as teachers were requested by an ever-growing number of pastors and bishops. By 1915 we were teaching in 44 schools. We also staffed a home for elderly (St. Francis Home, now Stonehill Care Center) and a boarding school for working women (Mary of the Angels). In 1930 in the midst of the Great Depression, we established Briar Cliff College (now University) in Sioux City. In the 1930's they also opened a school in Chicago for African American children, and a mission in China. Through the years other international missions followed in Chile, Guatemala, El Salvador, Poland, Tanzania and Zimbabwe. Our community also operated Xavier Hospital in Dubuque and two other hospitals through the years.

Today our community sponsors Shalom Spirituality Center and maintains a Franciscan influence in Stonehill Communities, Briar Cliff University, Mercy Hospital and Alverno Apartments. Sisters continue to serve as educators, pastoral associates, spiritual directors, social workers, administrators, mental health counselors, social justice advocates, and volunteers for many religious and civic organizations.

Our mission statement guides our work and life: "Rooted in the Gospel and in the Spirit of Francis and Clare the Sisters of St. Francis live in right relationship with all creation."

Presently we commit ourselves to ongoing conversion as we:

- Deepen our relationship with Mother Earth and Sister Water;
- Stand with persons who are poor;
- Make peace and practice nonviolence.

This commitment finds us involved in addressing the current needs of the day: the climate crisis, systemic racism, human trafficking, immigration reform, and the hunger for spirituality in our world.

Presently we minister in 10 states and in Honduras, St. Lucia and Canada. We number 181 perpetually professed sisters, one temporary professed, Sr. Reyna Helen Badillo Salazar who works as a Hispanic Outreach Coordinator in Okolona, MS, and one canonical novice, Sr. Katy Meylin Orellana Denos who presently lives at our Motherhouse in Dubuque and attends classes at Divine Word College. We also have 165 lay associates (141 in the United States and 24 in Central America).

From the Desk of Fr. Jon Seda, Vocations Director for the Archdiocese of Dubuque

Along with the Serra Club, the Knights of Columbus are wonderful supporters of vocations. They give generous support to our seminarians so that they can buy toothpaste, which I am in favor of. They also support our annual Iowa seminarian convocation and Iowa recently ordained priests' convocation.

This year the KCs are giving a one-time grant of \$5,000 to the vocation directors of the four Iowa dioceses for a new initiative. We will have a gathering of about 20 priests from the four Iowa dioceses in July to spark ideas on how to encourage our brother priests to be more active in inviting young people to consider the priesthood and religious life.



Only 30% of priests have ever invited someone to consider the priesthood, even though Msgr. Rosetti's studies have shown that Catholic priests report the highest levels of happiness compared to other "careers." Studies also show that the invitation and encouragement of one's pastor is often key to someone beginning to think and pray about the priesthood. What if our state could get the number of priests engaged in invitations up to 40, or 60 or 80%? Wow!

I suspect one reason this does not happen more often is that it is not urgent. I was a pastor for 20 years and know that much of one's day is responding to what happens that day. Matthew Kelly has said the most important thing is usually not the most urgent thing. Vocation ministry by the whole Church, and especially our priests, is critically important. But it is not the most urgent so often does not happen.

I want to take this occasion to express my gratitude to the Serra Club of Dubuque for your actions and especially your ongoing prayers for vocation ministry. Sometimes I have a great candidate contact me out of the blue, and wonder how did that happen? Then I think of you and your intercessory prayers, and it makes sense. Yes, we need to do our part, but it is the Holy Spirit who does the heavy lifting.

Prayers + Invitations = more priests and religious to serve our beloved Church. Thank you.
