

## The Epistle

### A Reading from the Acts of Apostles 10:34-43

Peter began to speak to them: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

## Holy Baptism

*As you are able, please stand, or adopt a posture of reverent prayer.*

### **Presentation and Examination of the Candidates**

*The Officiant says*

The Candidate(s) for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*Sponsors*

I present Kyle Louis Granville to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*The Officiant asks the candidate*

Do you desire to be baptized?

*I do.*

*Then the Officiant asks the following questions of the candidate*

*Question* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness  
that rebel against God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world  
which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

*Answer* I do.

*Question* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

*Answer* I do.

*Question* Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

*Answer* I do.

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Kyle in his life in Christ?

*People* We will!

*The Officiant then says these or similar words*

Let us join with Kyle who is committing himself to Christ  
and renew our own baptismal covenant.

## The Baptismal Covenant

*Officiant* Do you believe in God the Father?

*People* I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.

*Officiant* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*People* I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.  
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit  
and born of the Virgin Mary.  
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried.  
He descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again to judge the living and the dead

*Officiant* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People* I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting.

*Officiant* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship,  
in the breaking of the bread, and in the prayers?

*People* I will, with God's help.

*Officiant* Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin,  
repent and return to the Lord?

*People* I will, with God's help.

*Officiant* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

*People* I will, with God's help.

*Officiant* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

*People* I will, with God's help.

*Officiant* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people,  
and respect the dignity of every human being?

## Prayers for the Candidates

*The Officiant then says to the congregation*

Let us now pray for Kyle who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth

*A Person appointed leads the following petitions*

*Leader* Deliver him, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Open his heart to your grace and truth.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Fill him with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Keep him in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Teach him to love others in the power of the Spirit.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Send him into the world in witness to your love.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader* Bring him to the fullness of your peace and glory.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*The Officiant says*

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son  
may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory;  
who lives and reigns now and forever. *Amen.*

## Thanksgiving over the Water

*The Officiant blesses the water, first saying*

The Lord be with you.

*People* And also with you.

*Officiant* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People* It is right to give God thanks and praise.

*Officiant*

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water.

Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.

Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage

in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus

received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit

as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection,

from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism.  
In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection.  
Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.  
Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship  
those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father,  
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*At the following words, the Officiant touches the water*

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit,  
that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever  
in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit,  
be all honor and glory, now and for ever. *Amen.*

## **The Baptism**

*Each candidate is presented by name to the Officiant, or to an assisting priest or deacon, who then immerses, or pours water upon, the candidate, saying*

Kyle, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son,  
and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

*Then the Bishop or Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross [using Chrism if desired] saying*

Kyle, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism  
and marked as Christ's own for ever. *Amen.*

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon  
this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace.  
Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart,  
the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you,  
and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen.*

*When all have been baptized, the Officiant says*

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*Officiant and People*

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified,  
proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

### The Great Thanksgiving

*The people remain standing. The Officiant faces them and sings or says*

The Lord be with you.

*People*      And also with you.

*Officiant*      Lift up your hearts.

*People*      We lift them to the Lord.

*Officiant*      Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People*      It is right to give our thanks and praise.

*Officiant*

All thanks and praise are yours at all times and in all places, our true and loving God;  
through Jesus Christ, your eternal Word, the Wisdom from on high by whom you created all things.  
You laid the foundations of the world and enclosed the sea when it burst out from the womb;  
You brought forth all creatures of the earth and gave breath to humankind. Wondrous are you,  
Holy One of Blessing, all you create is a sign of hope for our journey; And so as the morning stars  
sing your praises we join the heavenly beings and all creation as we shout with joy:

Ho - ly Ho - ly ho - ly, Lord God of pow - er and might,  
 5 heav - en and earth are full of your glo - ry. Ho - san - na in the high - est.  
 9 Bless - ed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Ho - san - na in the high - est —

*The people stand or kneel. Then the Officiant continues*

Glory and honor are yours, Creator of all, your Word has never been silent; you called a people to yourself, as a light to the nations, you delivered them from bondage and led them to a land of promise. Of your grace, you gave Jesus to be human, to share our life, to proclaim the coming of your holy reign and give himself for us, a fragrant offering. Through Jesus Christ our Redeemer, you have freed us from sin, brought us into your life, reconciled us to you, and restored us to the glory you intend for us.

We thank you that on the night before he died for us Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, gave it to his friends and said: “Take, eat, this is my Body, broken for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.” After supper Jesus took the cup of wine, said the blessing, gave it to his friends and said: “Drink this, all of you: this cup is the new Covenant in my Blood, poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.”

And so, remembering all that was done for us: the cross, the tomb, the resurrection and ascension, longing for Christ’s coming in glory, and presenting to you these gifts your earth has formed and human hands have made, we acclaim you, O Christ:

*Officiant and People*

Dying, you destroyed our death.  
 Rising, you restored our life.  
 Christ Jesus, come in glory!

*The Officiant continues*

Send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts of bread and wine that they may be to us the Body and Blood of your Christ. Grant that we, burning with your Spirit’s power, may be a people of hope, justice and love. Giver of Life, draw us together in the Body of Christ, and in the fullness of time gather us with all your people into the joy of our true eternal home.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, we worship you our God and Creator in voices of unending praise. **AMEN**



## The Breaking of the Bread

*The Officiant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.*

*Facing the people, the Officiant says the following Invitation or similar words*

These are the gifts of God and we are the people of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

*Please be seated. If you wish to accept the invitation to communion, the ushers will direct you to the altar rail.*

**COMMUNION IS OPEN TO EVERYONE**  
**All are welcome to receive Holy Communion here.**

Please note that the wine we use in communion contains alcohol.

If you prefer, you are welcome to receive communion in one kind - that is, bread only.

There are also gluten-free wafers available upon request.

If you would prefer a blessing in lieu of communion,  
please indicate by folding your arms across your chest.

*The ministers receive the Sacrament in both kinds, and then immediately deliver it to the people, saying:*

The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven. [Amen.]

The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation. [Amen.]


