# WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT

**March 11, 2026**

**JBS Children's Services**

- JBS Children's Services offers intensive, home-based therapy and outpatient mental health services for children and adolescents aged 5-18 facing serious emotional and behavioral challenges. Their programs aim to prevent out-of-home placements by providing interventions tailored to each child's needs.

**April 8, 2026**

**Center for Youth Development and Intervention**

- CYDI provides evidence-based assessment and intervention services for children and adolescents with behavioral, emotional, and neurodevelopmental challenges. CYDI also conducts clinical research and offers training and consultation for families, educators, and providers to support youth development.

**May 6, 2026**

**Project Transition**

- Project Transition's Systems of Support program delivers intensive, community-based crisis intervention and stabilization for children and adults with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities and co-occurring behavioral health needs. By filling gaps in care, the program helps individuals remain safe, supported, and living in their communities.
