## Celebrating The Season of Business

#### BY GEORGE ~ "OUTSTANDING BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT"

This award recognizes a member who has successfully expanded its product lines and/or facilities and has shown significant growth and employment. This award also recognizes leadership and the entrepreneurial spirit of the principals of the organization.

George and Ronalyn were both born and raised in Monessen and now reside in Belle Vernon. They married in 1999 and have three sons Markello, Niko and Dimitri.

After 23 years working in the Carpenter's Union George found himself laid off and didn't want to travel out of the area for work. He knew he had to make a decision. Since cooking was always his true passion, he started to sell shish kabobs in the parking lot of Ronalyn's then scrapbook store on third street in Monessen. After a few weeks he was approached by Monessen Fireman's club and asked if he would be willing to open their kitchen and cook a few days a week, George agreed.

After 13 years running the Fireman's Club kitchen George felt it was time to step out on his own. In September of 2015 By George was officially open for business on Grand Blvd in Monessen, seating 62 people and employing 15 to 20 workers.

In 2017; George and Rona were able to purchase the Monessen Fireman's Club and renovate it for a catering facility. The catering business outgrew the facility so the pair decided this would be a great time to move the restaurant and have a larger venue. They would now be able to seat 125 people. So, in September of 2019 the move took place and their staff nearly doubled to 37 employees.

Also, later that year in December By George became the exclusive caterer for St Spyridon's Hellenic Center.

Fast forward to June 2023, By George had the honor of a lifetime by appearing in an episode of America's Best Restaurants. If you haven't seen the episode, you can find it on YouTube.

From starting with no restaurant experience to growing to a 125 seating capacity restaurant, staff of 37 and becoming an exclusive caterer for an event center, all in the matter of 8 years.

When asked what makes it all work, the first thing they agreed on is staff. Especially one staff member in particular, head chef Jamie Kepich who has been with them from the start.

I would like to take a minute to mention their generosity. George and Rona give back to their community, through private donations, countless hours of volunteering and services to many charities and organizations. If there is a need in the community George and Ronalyn are always quick to provide support. Always wanting to fly below the radar. They appreciate and value their community and that is evident by their actions.



#### STUDIO K ~ "EXCELLENCE IN BUSINESS"

This award recognizes a member business that continually and consistently provides its customers with outstanding products and/or services. Demonstrated longevity is an important aspect that the Chamber of Commerce wishes to recognize, and considers businesses operating for 20 years or more.

Studio K is owned and operated by Miss Karen Kosh. Karen was born and raised in Rostraver where she lives with her significant other, Jim Posey, and 2 step children

Karen attended Westmoreland CCC majoring in business with the plan to go into fashion. During her last semester of college, she was looking for a side hustle to make a little extra cash until her career got up and running. At this time the nail business was just starting to become popular and being ambitious, she started cosmetology school in Uniontown in tandem with finishing her last semester at college.

Upon graduation in 1997 she started to work at a local nail salon in Belle Vernon There she would meet Gianna McFaddin and Rachel Berklovich. Immediately these girls formed a strong friendship. They continued to work together and build their clientele over the next five years. Karen, being from a family that was no stranger to business ownership and knowing what it takes, she was starting to get the itch to take the leap and start her own salon.

After careful consideration, she knew the building at 329 Fallowfield Ave in Charleroi was the perfect future home for her business. With her girls Gianna and Rachel joining her crew, she was ready. Studio K opened its doors, July 9th, 2001.

Studio K Serves as a full-service salon doing Nails, Pedicures, tanning, spray tanning, massages, facials, and permanent makeup. Karen's family was there every step of the way to help and support her. Since 2001 her business has never stopped growing. She currently has 3 other nail techs besides herself, (Rachel, Paige and Gianna) an esthetician (Debbie) and massage therapist (Sydnee).

Karen is that business owner that no matter when you enter her shop you are greeted with her smiling face. She invests her heart, soul, and endless hours into her business.

Karen is also committed to the community. Whenever donations are needed for Christmas, for the town fireworks or Halloween festivities, she generously gives, she has sold more tickets for the fire department and organizations than most people combined. When you walk into Studio K, you feel as if you are the only, most important client that has ever walked through the door.

#### HIS PLACE COFFEE, COMMUNITY AND MORE ~ "REGIONAL SERVICE AWARD"

This Mon Valley Regional Chamber of Commerce recognizes local organizations and institutions that contribute to the quality of life in the Mid Mon Valley. Human services, educational, recreational, charitable, cultural and economic development entities are among those considered for this award.

A few years back, Pastor Tim Burgan and Cornerstone TV hosted a program called His Place in which the Pastor welcomed guests to talk about their situations, struggles and life in general. The Pastor thought how great would it be to make His Place a real place where people could come, gather, and support one another, to form a community family of sorts.

In comes Lisa Lyons, after some time and soul-searching, God put it in her heart to not only make a coffee shop where all were welcome but to make this vision happen in Monessen. This is where she felt led and this town was in need of such a place and she wasn't wrong. As always God's timing worked out perfectly and their sights were set on the former police and fire station on 3<sup>rd</sup> street in Monessen. September 13, 2021 their doors were open and they were ready to start making a difference. Right now, they employ many young adults from the church giving them work experience as well as learning the importance giving back to the community.

Some of the programs offered: Storytime, Kids craft day, tutoring, celebrate recovery-program held weekly to help with addiction, back to school supply drive, blessing bags at Christmas to name a few.

The coffee shop is only the beginning, they have started work on the other side of the building which so far includes a fully equipped sewing room where they welcome anyone who would like to learn to sew from a former sewing teacher, thanks to a generous doner there is a gym for kids that includes electronic equipment to give an interactive workout. They have now started a robotics program that includes Mon Valley Mammoth Robotics program. The program consists of four teams from K-12 for public, cyber and homeschooled. All teams are part of the First Robotics and are competitive teams.

His place has also arranged for a local barber and beautician to come to their center where a salon

room has been created 32 students received personal invitations to get a free haircut and a new pair of sneakers and socks, appropriately called snips and sneakers. At this time, they have started with the Monessen School District but they are hoping to be able to expand beyond Monessen to other districts.

There is much much more on the horizon such as medical and dental services, pro bono legal service Tax and financial guidance, counseling, addiction services and so much more.



#### DR. ED ZELICH ~ "SHINING STAR AWARD"

MVRCC selects an individual that displays outstanding personal and professional attributes. This award goes to a Chamber member who shows a commitment to his/her vocation, helps to advance the mission of the Mon Valley Regional Chamber, and promotes the Mid Mon Valley community at large.

Dr. Zelich earned his Bachelor of Science in education from IUP, his Masters of Science in Educational Leadership from California University, with certifications as a secondary and elementary principal, and his Superintendent Letter of Eligibility through Edinboro University. In 2016 he earned a doctorate of Education Degree in Administration and Leadership studies at IUP.

The early years of his career took him to Waynesburg. This is where he met his wife of 32 years, Brenda. Brenda also taught, retiring last year from Laurel Highlands after 34 years of service. Ed and Brenda share two sons, Zeke and Luke, who have both followed in their footsteps becoming educators, one at Laurel Highlands and the other at Albert Gallatin.

Dr. Zelich began his appointment as Superintendent of Charleroi School District on July 1, 2014. He serves more than 1500 students in the district; Charleroi Area school district is known for having a strong academic reputation as well as a wide range of educational programs and first-rate facilities. Before joining the Charleroi family, Dr. Zelich served in a variety of teaching and administrative roles from 1988-2014, he was in the classroom for 12 years, he was assistant principal, principal, Assistant Superintendent and now superintendent.

This is a man who goes above and beyond for his teachers and his students. He tries to attend all of the extra curricular activities and sporting events. He traveled with the boys' soccer team to Harrisburg just a few weeks back. Many mornings Ed stands outside greeting every elementary student as they are dropped off. He has also taken a few students under his wing and "adopted" them to make sure they have what they need to be able to graduate and at times make sure their basic needs are met.

Let's not forget covid days at which time Dr. Zelich had to set up a complete online learning system with all of the rules and regulations that were changing not only by the day but by the hour. He rose to the task and always had the students' best interest at heart no matter



how difficult the decisions were. The truth of the matter is good leadership starts at the top, and Dr. Zelich is a perfect example.
