

Andrew Radin Receives Product Stewardship Award

Andrew Radin, Director of Recycling and Waste Reduction at the Onondaga County Resource Recovery Agency, was recently recognized with a national award for his work with product stewardship issues.

Radin, presented with the “Thoughtful Motivator Award” was among a group of Environmental Stewards in industry and government recognized at the Product Stewardship Institute’s Conference in Boston, MA.

According to the release from PSI, “as chair of the New York Product Stewardship Council and a participant on PSI’s Board of Directors, Andrew continues to make a consistent impact on environmental policy through his thoughtfulness and tact. He has spearheaded efforts to build support for numerous extended producer responsibility bills in New York, including for paint, electronics, pharmaceuticals, and batteries.
