

Every year from May - July tens of thousands of horseshoe crabs make their way into the Coastal Bays to spawn and lay eggs.

The Maryland Coastal Bays is a hotspot for horseshoe crab spawning and as a result the Maryland Coastal Bays Program conducts annual surveys to assess how the population is doing.

Unfortunately, there are some areas in the Coastal Bays that have obstacles that cause the horseshoe crabs to become stranded on while spawning. These strandings lead to mass causalities which is why MCBP is establishing a team of dedicated volunteers to go out to these locations and help rescue stranded horseshoe crabs.
