Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Leader: Our God comes to live among us! With Mary, His mother, let us celebrate His birth!

All: O God, help us to trust, as Mary did, the Mystery of Your great love for us!

A Reading: John 3:16-21

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because they have not believed in the name of God's one and only Son. This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil. Everyone who does evil hates the light and will not come into the light for fear that their deeds will be exposed. But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what they have done has been in the sight of God.

Leader: We light these four candles as a sign of our joy in Your choosing to enter into our humanity through the womb of Mary. The purple candle is a sign of Love. (Four candles are lit. Silence is kept.)
