CLASSROOM CHATTER

Check out what has been happening in some of our classrooms recently:

JK: In Science last week, Ms. Hoffman's JK class created apple volcanoes. They made predictions (and a fun mess) on what would happen when you mix vinegar with baking soda (see picture).

SK: Ms. Johnson's Senior Kindergarten superstars made applesauce last week to study the process of osmosis in Science (see picture). The students will decorate pumpkins and create their own pumpkin patch outside of their classroom. Take a trip downstairs and check it out at the end of the month.

2nd: Mrs. Sorg's spectacular second graders were "seeing spots" or dots! The students had a lot of fun on Dot Day during which they learned about creativity, collaboration and "making your mark" Through share Peter H. Reynold's book *The Dot*. Second graders played the 30 Circles Challenge, a timed activity in which filled in circles on a page with as many different patterns as possible. 

Art lecturer Rhea Sprecher provided a class lesson prior to the field trip to prepare them for what they would see. Once in the buildings seeing first-hand the ornate and impeccable work by Wright that is known around the world, they students began to appreciate living and attending school in such an architecturally rich community. Fifth grade will lead chapel with their sixth grade friends on Tuesday, October 2, and all families are welcome. 6th: Along with the fulfilling field trip and chapel preparations, Mrs. Clauss' sixth grade class has been busy in Science making models of cells out of various household items.
