Maundy Thursday-April 1, 2021

Maundy Thursday (also known as Holy Thursday, Covenant Thursday, Great and Holy Thursday (also Holy and Great Thursday), Sheer Thursday, and Thursday of Mysteries, among other names) is **the Christian holy day falling on the Thursday before Easter**. It commemorates the Washing of the Feet (Maundy) and Last Supper of Jesus Christ with the Apostles, as described in the canonical gospels. It is the fifth day of Holy Week, preceded by Holy Wednesday (Spy Wednesday) and followed by Good Friday. "Maundy" comes from the Latin word *mandatum*, or commandment, reflecting Jesus' words "I give you a new commandment." The day comes always between March 19 and April 22, inclusive, and will vary according to whether the Gregorian calendar or the Julian calendar is used. Eastern churches generally use the Julian system. Maundy Thursday initiates the Easter Triduum, the period which commemorates the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus; this period includes Good Friday and Holy Saturday and ends on the evening of Easter. The Mass of the Lord's Supper or service of worship is normally celebrated in the evening, when Friday begins according to Jewish tradition, as the Last Supper was held on the feast of Passover, according to the three Synoptic Gospels.

Holy Week

Maundy Thursday services will be held Thursday, April 1st, online only. The recording will be emailed as usual and can also be accessed on the church website.

Good Friday April 2nd. We regret the Meetinghouse will not be open as in years past due to Covid restrictions.

Easter Sunday Sunrise Services 8 a.m. April 4th. Join us at Bent of the River. (see below)

Easter Sunday Services 10 a.m. April 4th. Worship in the Meetinghouse with Wayne Gunther, June Bennett, and Ann Ferraro performing beloved Easter hymns.

Easter Sunday April 4th. There will be the **Flowering of the Cross and Heart**, to celebrate leaving the sadness of the crucifixion to the Joy of the resurrection and Jesus' unending Love. Flowers will be left on the church steps after the 10 o'clock service for those who are unable to attend services.



Join us at Bent of the River for our “sunrise” service featuring beautiful guitar music played by Jacob Krauss, a young artist and music scholar from Amawalk, NY.

APPLE FESTIVAL

While it is still a long way off, preparations are already underway for this year's Apple Festival, to take place on September 25.

Here are some opportunities to get involved!

ASSISTANT Exhibitors Chair: We are looking for somebody to assist the chair with the following: planning the exhibitors' areas and coordinating with Property/Set-up, coordinating communications with Exhibitors, and supervising arrival, set-up and break down of the Exhibitor areas with a team of volunteers. The process of securing Exhibitors is going on now and is well underway. It is hoped that the Assistant Exhibitors Chair will take over the chair position next year with assistance from the prior chair.

Flower Arrangement Competition Chair: Use your creativity to help conceive and implement a new revenue-generating event for Apple Festival! Secure participants to create and donate arrangements for display in a designated area or as an extension of pick-a-prize. Arrange for the sale of tickets, perhaps in conjunction with pick-a-prize, to be used as votes. **This would be an easy, fun area for somebody who would like to try chairing for the first time.**

COVID-19 Implementation Chair: Work closely with Festival Director to ensure that all COVID-19 guidelines are followed. Along with the Festival Chair, become knowledgeable about the sector guidelines and requirements for all areas of the festival (these will be provided). Supervise dedicated team of volunteers on the day of the Festival. Coordinate signage placement throughout festival areas to communicate requirements and to direct foot traffic flow as part of festival set-up. Help inventory cleaning and sanitizing products and distribute to all areas on the morning of festival. Help to ensure all volunteers who are not already trained participate in the education and training presentation (already created). **This job will generally consist of implementing a program that was designed last year, along with the Festival Chair. While not difficult, we cannot have our festival without this position in place!**

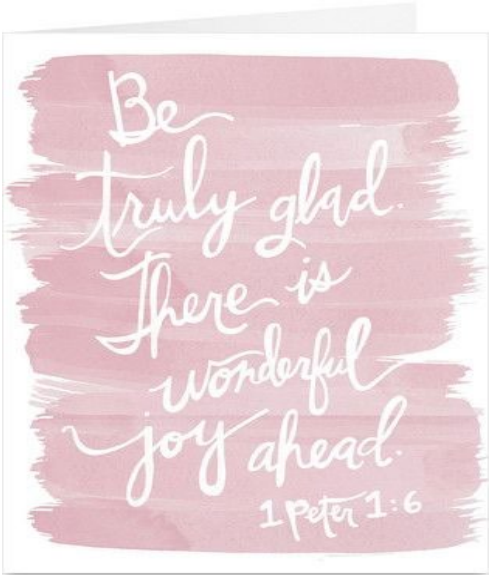

MEMORIAL GARDEN

Pine Meadow Gardens is planning to do their work during the third week of April. They will be planting Eleven 6/7' Arborvitae evergreen trees, one 5/6' Norway Spruce and one Rhododendron. They will also expand some of the planting bed outward and transplant

four or five existing shrubs into that area.

To prepare for that work, Bob's Tree Service is presently removing all the existing maple trees along the property line between the planting bed and the Old Methodist Church. Most of these trees were compromised in some way and did not have a promising future. This will allow for much needed sunlight for the new plantings. This portion of the project is being funded through the Bassett Minor Maintenance Fund.

Holly Bucciarelli, the owner of the Old Methodist Church, has provided us with a source of water for the new plantings. I am hoping that we can set up a schedule of volunteers to carry that out without over-burdening any one person.

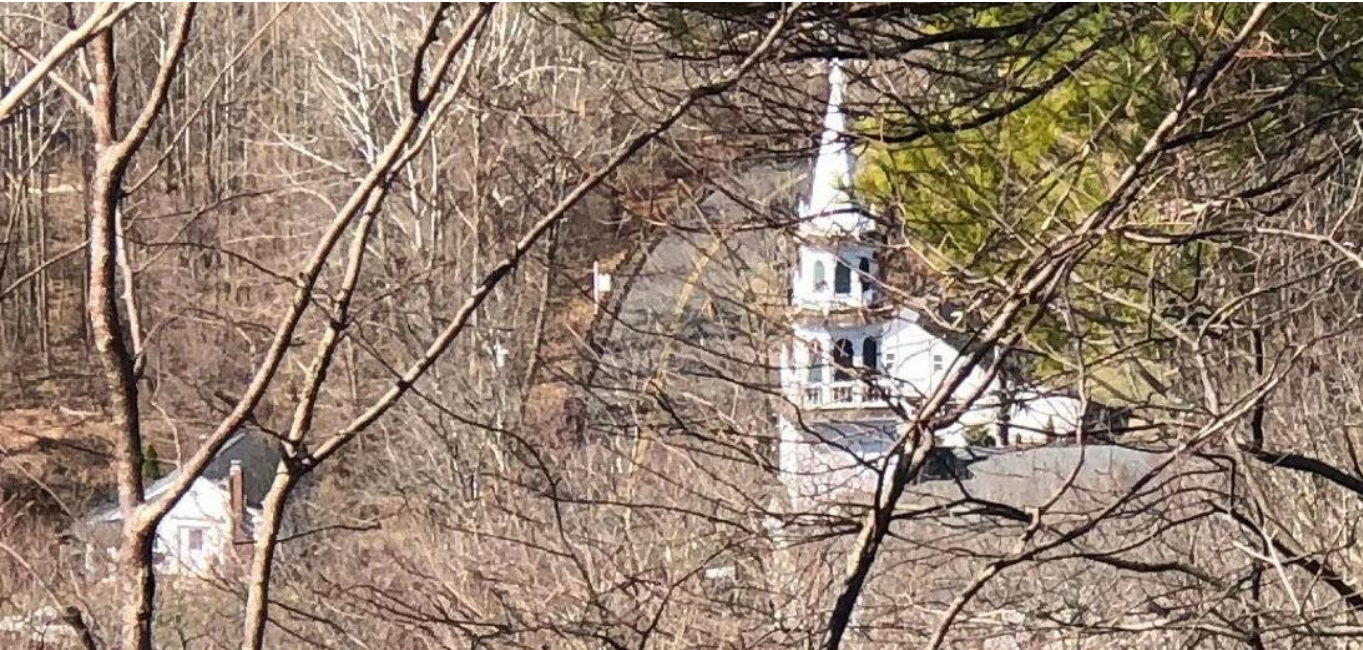
