Your name and dedication will appear in the worship bulletins. If two people sign up for the same date, flowers can be placed in other locations in the Sanctuary, such as on the organ or piano or at the baptismal font. We do not have flowers at the altar during lent.

The season of Advent marks our aching, human plea for mercy. Many of us are familiar with Advent as a season of waiting for God's incarnation in Jesus, but we have to know that Jesus is God's answer to our desperate plea for mercy. The cry we raise to God is the groan of our frustration with a world that somehow manages to be senseless, confusing, unsparing, cruel, and arrestingly beautiful all at once. It is a season that grants us a period of time to reckon with the stark sense that our best, most ingenious machinations to engineer our lives are not enough to deliver us from ourselves and that we need help. As David James Duncan writes in his epic novel, Sun House, "moaning is connected with hope."

Loss of faith in ourselves is the birthplace of faith in God, and when that happens the impossible becomes not only possible, but real and true: the very place that seems totally absent of God is truly filled with God. Faith's birth in our lives could be the very last thing we ever wanted. But its appearance has nothing to do with us or our plans (which is exactly the point), it is the beginning of our education in knowing God's mercy and becoming truly aware of life beyond our own. God's mercy is always bigger than what our personal lives and needs. There is an entire creation wild for relief to care for and God's mercy is for all God has made.

What will your Advent plea for mercy be this year? What is our moan? For what personal circumstances? For what family matters? For which creatures of the earth? For which ecologies? For what nations? God have mercy on us all and bring us to hope..

Pray with me.

Gracious and holy God, lead us from death to life, from falsehood to truth. Lead us from despair to hope, from fear to trust. Lead us from hate to love, from war to peace. Let peace fill our hearts, our world, our universe; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen. (ELW Leader's Desk Edition, pg. 145).

PRINCE OF PEACE PRE-SCHOOL




As the holiday season is upon us, Prince of Peace Pre-School families and staff are preparing to share their voices with holiday caroling the weeks of December 8th and 15th.

Avoid glass jars and fragile packaging.

- Soup (especially chicken noodle)
- Rice (1, 2 or 3 pound bags)
