Dear Members and Friends of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church:

May 18<sup>th</sup> was the celebration of The Ascension of our Lord. Ascension Day is the 40<sup>th</sup> day of the season of Easter. After Christ's Resurrection, he appeared to his disciples many times. It was a time a teaching and encouragement for the disciples. Then on Ascension Day, Christ gathered all of his disciples, blessed them, and ascended to the Father in heaven.

The disciples were now on their own. I'm sure they were frightened and confused. But very quickly, they went to work building the church of Christ on earth.

This is the time of year when we celebrate graduations. Congratulations to all graduates in our congregation! But the word "graduation" feels like a word that describes something has finished. Perhaps that's why we also use the word "commencement", because a graduation is not an end, but it signifies something is about to begin: new work, vocation, or focus in life.

On June 4th we are celebrating what has been traditionally called "Confirmation" in the life of the church. But there is a better word here as well. We talk about this event as "Affirmation of Baptism". The students who are being recognized are affirming the promises made at their Baptisms. They are moving forward in the next stage of their Christian life and faith.

It's all a matter of perspective: Graduation vs. Commencement; Confirmation vs. Affirmation of Baptism.

Whatever we do in the life of the church is really a matter of perspective. We can do things "because we have to", or we can be excited about new opportunities and possibilities.

My impression of Prince of Peace is that this congregation has a very healthy perspective. There is energy, enthusiasm, a good work-ethic, and a desire to keep moving forward with new opportunities and possibilities. I am very excited about the future for this congregation.

On Ascension Day, Jesus left his disciples with these words, "Go, make disciples". That is still our calling and our challenge. As the people of God at Prince of Peace Lutheran that is the challenge that Christ has given us as well: "Go, make disciples." May it be so.

## NEW ENGLAND SYNOD ASSEMBLY

The Annual New England Synod 2023 Assembly will take place from Friday, June 9 through Saturday, June 10, 2023 at the DCU Center in Worcester, MA.

The theme will be *A Church Born in the Tomb: Death & Resurrection in the 21st Century Church*. Among the topics to be addressed at this assembly: plans for the 2024 bishop election process, follow-up report of the anti-racism group, presentations on collaboration projects from around the synod, and a conversation around the many ways we are seeing death, resurrection and new ways of being the body of Christ in this century.

On Friday, Bishop Regina Hassanally will preach at the evening worship, taking place at Trinity Lutheran Church in Worcester.

On Saturday, Executive Conference Minister Rev. Darrell Goodwin will preacher for the closing worship, taking place at the DCU Center in Worcester.

The two voting members from PoP will be Jim and Marci Sharp. Pastor Mark and Caryl Grorud will also be in attendance as voting members of their congregation.

# COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES FROM 4/26/23

In attendance: Lorraine, Linda, Donna, Heather, Nan, Meg, Liz, Laura, Monica, Meeghan and Pastor Mark.

**Agenda & March Minutes** – Approved

**Members in Need** – June G., Gene & Maimo P., Ken C.

**Budget Update** – Increased pledging shows a good foundation for a new Pastor but needs to be sustainable.

**American Red Cross** – Our October date was cancelled. Search for other options.

**Budget Task Force** – Contracts are being reviewed to help identify areas to cut costs.

**Property Committee** – A motion was made and approved to accept a bid from VRP Flooring to replace carpets in the Preschool, church offices and green room for a cost of up to \$22,000 to be done during the summer. The money will come from the Misty Hollow sale which has funds designated for capital improvements.

**Faith Formation/Youth Group** – Sunday School will end on June 11<sup>th</sup> with the church picnic. Youth group delivered three carts of food from the food drive. A successful community Easter egg hunt earned \$185 which was donated to Daily Bread.

**Worship and Music** – Brian will begin introducing new hymns to services.

**Caring Committee** – There is a great need for food at the food pantry.

**Parish Life/Fellowship** – Planning is ongoing for the church picnic on June 11<sup>th</sup>. A form was created for Funeral Services including a breakdown of expenses. More volunteers are needed to help.

**Preschool** – A motion was made to approve the alumni wall. 9 were in favor, 1 abstained.

**Call Committee** – Steve Davies named as Chairman, Paul Adam as the Council Rep and Heather Pontonio will join the Call Committee as the Transition Team Rep. A motion was made and approved to add Heather to the Call Committee.

**Confirmands** – A motion was made and approved for Alexis Bernardez, Caroline Dore, Olivia Gerardi, Julia Hlouskova, Kiera McCaffrey and Alex Zweig to be confirmed on June 4<sup>th</sup>.

**Transition Committee** – A motion was made and approved to accept the MSP (Ministry Site Profile) with the recommended changes. This will be submitted to Rev. Wilco to begin the call process.

**Nominating Committee** – Meeting on Sunday to discuss nominees for church council.

**Bylaws/Resolutions** – A guideline letter for Committee leaders was reviewed & revised.

A little about Friday Night Live...

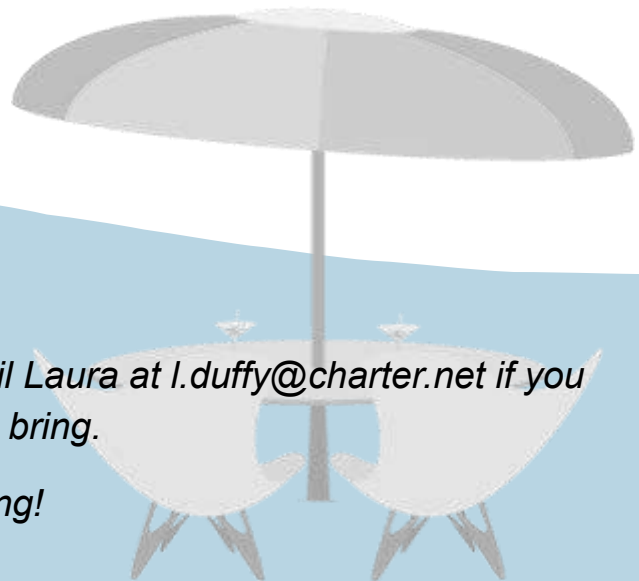

With the cost of food, the pantry is giving out approximately 200 bags of groceries every three days that they distribute food.

***They need everything especially mac and cheese, peanut butter and pasta.***

Please note the items that are listed below for the pantry. They tend to be the most nutritious and are easy to distribute.

Avoid glass jars and fragile packaging.

- Canned tuna, salmon or chicken
- Beans (canned or dry)
- Peanut butter
- Meal-in-a-can (beef stew, spaghetti & meatballs, etc.)
- Soup (especially chicken noodle)
- Rice (1, 2 or 3 pound bags)
- Pasta
- Macaroni and cheese
- Canned corn
- Canned vegetables
- Canned fruit
- Breakfast cereal (hot or cold)
- Marinara sauce and canned tomato products
