Dear Friends and Members of Prince of Peace,

When I was a kid, we rode bikes with no helmets, traveled in cars without safety belts, and even drank water out of the hose. You too? Today that is considered at risk behavior. And while I think being protective of our children and others is generally a good thing. I have also seen how it can become a problem when we fall into the erroneous belief that the goal of life is to be safe and comfortable.

How important is being comfortable to you at this stage of your life?

St. Paul suggests a different goal for us in his letter to the church in Rome. *Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you.* (The Message)

The life Paul refers to is only achieved by moving away from our focus on self-comfort. The goal of the Christian life is to leave behind ourselves and our own desires. If we truly want to grow in our character and our faith, then we must be willing to change our goal from one of safety to one of sacrifice.

What creature comfort would be difficult for you to live without at this time in your life?

God created us to be a part of a grand adventure. God designed us to take risks and face challenges, to accomplish mighty goals that will have a lasting impact. One of the most powerful and impactful ways we experience this grand adventure is in community. Whether it is through Prince of Peace or your school or company or neighborhood or family, we are called together to help others. If you want to experience the full adventure that your life is intended to be, then you have to be willing to take action and serve those in need with God's love.

What sacrifice of time, resources or comfort might be God calling you to today?

*Faithful God, you care for us day by day, and with you as our companion we are never alone. Grant to each one of your children fulfillment in life, confidence in your steadfast love, and support in the community of your people in order that we may live sacrificially to your glory; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.*

## WHAT DO YOU THINK?

In a recent article (Churches Who Survive the Pandemic Will do Three Things) written by Chris Morton and shared in Fresh Expressions, aspect for congregational survival are suggested. I'd like to explore all three in this space for as many months. I do so in hopes of a conversation about Prince of Peace and life on the other side on this pandemic. So, please read and let me know what you think.

### Invest in Distributed Leadership

Churches who thrive during and after the pandemic must let go of their individual pastor-centric model and distribute the church's work to capable leaders.

Churches that will thrive in the pandemic and beyond will focus on distributing the church's work away from single individuals managing large gatherings to a multiplicity of leaders empowered to lead smaller segments in initiatives befitting the needs and limitations of the moment.

If this sounds familiar, it's precisely what the early church had to do. Acts 6 tells of how the Apostles commissioned others to manage the day-to-day tasks so they could focus on teaching. Many churches have avoided this dispersal of power, choosing instead to allow paid professionals to do this work.

### Five Ways to Start Distributing Your Church

1. Study the shift towards de-professionalization and empowerment, focusing on texts such as Acts 6.
2. Celebrate publicly the work of individuals who are already gathering people safely, loving and serving their neighbors, discipling new believers and caring for the needy.
3. Identify pioneering leaders who can experiment with fresh expressions initiatives that safely gather church members as well as non-Christians.
4. Encourage people to gather in safe ways by geography or affinity. Use tools for simple liturgies or service projects.
5. Commission those who have a proven capacity for roles such as teachers, counselors, and organizers of tasks to pursue these opportunities officially. In turn, paid leaders should focus on empowering these newly commissioned leaders to grow in their roles.

There you have it. The first characteristic of congregation that will survive the pandemic.

1. What do you think? What do you understand is being suggested? Do you agree?
2. How would that look at Prince of Peace? What would be lost? What would be gained?
3. Is this a direction we should go?

Let's talk about this. Call or email me what you think. Share your thoughts with a Council member or someone on the Forward Leadership Team. We will talk about it during coffee/social hour and other places as well.
