Spring is a wonderful time here at Prince of Peace.

We are welcoming new members in May and welcoming the newly baptized in June. This is most typically how new folks come into our fellowship. Such joyful occurrences always cause me to reflect on the nature of the church. I ask myself (and by implication, you) what does it mean to be a baptized child of God? And because there are no individual Christians, what does it mean to be a baptized member of the church?

Baptism is always what God does. If baptized as an infant then God comes to us before we can talk, know much, or promise anything. If baptized later then God doesn't consider what we have to say, what we know, or what we might want to promise. We are Christian because of being drowned and raised by God in the waters of baptism. This status as a baptized child of God never expires. We are our whole life long one of God's children – loved, forgiven, and never alone.

Baptism means community. There are no individual Christians. We are only Christian together. This is both a curse and a blessing. I need you to help me be a Christian – you who are not like me, who I get frustrated with, who don't value the same things as I do. I need you to speak God's word of forgiveness, to share God's peace with, to work together in God's mission. To quote the *New Member Litany* from our May 1, 2022 worship - It is the Spirit of caring for one another, of forgiving, of helping each other, of weeping and rejoicing together, it is the Spirit of love revealed in the life and death of Jesus.

It is my prayer that the gift of the Spirit be ours together, this season of Easter, uniting, inspiring, leading and calling us, and the whole world, to newness of life. I am thankful for you and glad our lives are bound together and to God: through Jesus Christ our lord.

Claim your baptism. Live in community. Affirm your discipleship. He is Risen!

COUNCIL CLIPPINGS



Council met on April 27, 2022

They reviewed Easter Activities:

- Recent Fundraiser for the Crisis in the Ukraine include the Youth Group project of selling Easter chocolate, which yielded over \$300.
- An Easter Hunt was held for the community on April 9th. More than 80 children attended. Egg hunts, games and Easter Bunny pictures were available. The Bake sale yielded more than \$300.
- A collection of more money was done for Ukraine after playing of the Ukraine National Anthem as a postlude for a worship service.
- The worship service for Easter Morning was attended by more than 79 people who enjoyed wonderful Easter music and Anthem.

There will be a New England Synod Assembly in Worcester, June 9-11, 2022. Participating will be Pastor and Janet Lutz and two 2 voting members -Meg McLoone and Nan Carlson.

The church council will meet for an afternoon retreat on May 1, 2022, after a Thank You Reception for Pastor and Janet Lutz.

The June Congregational Meeting will follow the worship service on June 12, 2022. Church Council Members will be voted on for the coming fiscal year. A picnic lunch is planned for the whole church, following the congregational meeting. SAVE the DATE.

New members will join on May 1st and a Baptism is planned for May 22nd and June 5th.

Jim Sharp has been working on the update of our Constitution.

By now, we have heard of the sale of Misty Hollow with a net gain of over \$400,000. The following is a list of projects which have been on hold in the past few years. The Executive Committee, Church Council as well as the Property Committee are managing the following recommendations:

- Organ electrical system, with safety concerns
- Flooring and furniture for the Youth Room
- Church Sign- Update and relocation
- Wi-Fi /New computers- in "the works"
- Possible new AC for church in future
- Possible cut down two evergreen trees in front of church to increase visibility of sign.

Actions taken:

A motion was made and passed to invest half of the proceed in long-term and short-term funds following the recommendation of Finance Committee member Rich Mercado.

A motion was made and passed to use 10% of the proceeds to help our neighbors in need around the world under the direction of the Council.

Pastor Lutz, as acting Dean of the Naugatuck Valley Conference, will install two Pastors in congregations in Southbury and Waterbury.

Danny Smith, a frequent worshiper, has been ordained in the Christ Catholic Church – Worldwide denomination. His ordination took place in Prince of Peace on Maundy Thursday 2022.

Council meets again on Wednesday, May 18 at 7:00 p.m.

How does this sound today? How are we doing resisting normalcy two-years later?

April 2020

Dear People of God,

Let's not go back to normal.

What was normal, after all, but a false assumption about the world and our place in it. Built on the flawed understanding that we are in control. We're not.

Normal was how we construct this worldview by holding on to certain conventions while dismissing others, all out of ego and an inflated sense of self-importance. Normal is a lie, a facade, a closed tomb. Let's not go back to normal.

To do so would mean we worship ourselves and not the Living Lord. To go back to normal would be to pretend that the virus was an exception, an unusual event, a blimp in an otherwise understandable and manageable universe. To go back to normal would be to pretend that sin, evil, and death doesn't exist. To go back perpetuates the myth that it is all about us. It isn't.

It is the dawning of a new day, my friends, the birth pangs of a new reality. The stone is gone! All that we thought was possible, probably, predictable and permanent, changed on that bright morning. We have come face to face with our own mortality and the mortality of our worldview.

We are now at a moment of decision. Do we seek comfort in the former or do we move toward the future with Easter eyes, recalculate the possibilities of life amid illness, disease, and death? Do we continue to admire an empty tomb, longing for what was, or do we follow the Risen Lord?

The Christ of scripture says that if you want to be first, you must be last; if you want to live, you have to die; and if you want to hold on to anything – health, wealth, family, life - you have to do so with open hands.

So, now with Christ ahead of us, let's step out of normal into his resurrection life. Let's follow the living Lord by dying to self and by keeping our hands open for the amazing gifts and promises of God that flow to us unconditionally.

What will it mean for you to live as a baptized child of God in this new reality? And because there is no such thing as an individual Christian, what will it mean for you to live with others? Are you ready for a life outside the tomb, a life of surprises, a life of love, and abundance?

Let's leave normal behind, cling to each other, and the God who has called us together to be Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. A new day awaits us, someplace better!

Can I get an Amen?

Musings from the Bench!

How time flies! It seems like only yesterday that we embarked on rebuilding and renewing our music program. Both the Sanctuary Choir and Handbell Choir have faithfully returned to rehearsing weekly and engaged in active worship. In March, albeit small, our Youth music program returned with an initial offering joining the Sanctuary choir. Even more engaging and exciting news was the gift of a small tracker pipe organ for our youth and 'young at heart' to learn about the process of how it works and to develop a plan to refurbish and restore it to its former glory. To that end, I would like to tell you the 'rest of the story'!

As some may know, our Sanctuary organ needs work and there will be more about that in the future, but as a preface to that, I have been actively looking and exploring many different social media accounts to see what future options may look like. It was during one of these fact-finding missions that I came across a listing that read in part ... *"Pipe Organ, Tracker action ... best bid to someone capable of re-assembling and using the instrument; free donation to a church or an educational institution that will use this instrument for its intended purpose". Needless to say this caught my eye and I pondered, how this might serve a purpose here at POP. The other part of the listing that caught my eye was this instrument was located in someone's residence, so it couldn't be that big. The footprint in total is actually about the size of a king size bed, and no more than 8' in height, when fully assembled. Hmmm ... This post appeared on a Monday. So I made an inquiry if this instrument might serve the needs of a growing youth music program, exposing them not only to the inner workings of a mechanical pipe organ, but having the full potential of being used as an instrument for future students to learn upon. Furthermore, would that fill the need as listed by the current owner. That same evening there was a scheduled W&M meeting where I proposed the same question, in which they met it with great enthusiasm, considering not only our current needs, but embracing potential future growth of the program.*

It was great joy that the very next day, there was an email from the owners letting me know that they had decided, based on the proposal of use, they would love to give the organ to us. You see, unbeknownst to me at the time, there was another interested party, and in full disclosure, the owners were also Lutheran :-)

The organ itself is a c. 1898/1908 Bernhard Mudler tracker organ with a reverse console (rare in its own right) and was manufactured in Philadelphia. On Easter Sunday, with the help of Paul Adam, Erik Zimmitti, his sons and others, we unloaded the truck with our new project. A project it will be, but one that I know in the end will bring great satisfaction to all who will partake in its rebirth. More to come next month.
