Minutes of the Annual Congregational  
Budget Meeting  
January 30, 2022**

27 members were present at church, 14 members via Zoom.

Congregational Meeting was chaired by Lorraine Lavery, President, Church Council. Meeting began at 11:00 a.m. Opening prayer was given by Pastor Lutz.

Agenda was adopted and 2021 minutes accepted.

Members are encouraged to read the committee reports presented today.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor reported on new membership statistics. All people are welcome at church, whether they are members or not. No privileges, when requested, will be withheld regardless of membership.

Financial Reports:

Sincere gratitude was expressed for Rich Mercado's service for several years at Prince of Peace. Rich served as Treasurer for ... He presented the budget for 2021 and 2022. Priscilla Rivas-Mancione, new Treasurer was introduced to the congregation.

2021 Budget had a budgeted deficit of \$53,914 but we were able to receive \$76,177 from the Payroll Protection Program and ended with a surplus of \$80,840. We received two PPP contributions which are subject to forgiveness.

2022 Budget includes a deficit of \$66,966. Overall church Finances include available undesignated/unrestricted funds of \$143,854 generated from special giving and the Payroll Protection Program to cover this deficit.

The 2022 budget was presented in a motion and passed by a majority.

Cemetery Budget:

The Cemetery budget was presented by Rich and Ernie Lehman. 50% of income earned by the sale of plots is placed in a Perpetual Care Fund. Ernie extended thanks to Rich Mercado for his guidance. He was also grateful to those people who do clean-up of the cemetery property. Probate Court will file the budget. The motion to approve the budget was passed.

2022 minutes continued

Nominating Committee:

The following members were appointed to be members of the Nominating Committee: Heidi Adam, Susan Lehmann, Tina Giubileo, Julie Parker, Heather Pontonio and Mary Weisensee. They are responsible for identifying members of the congregation with good leadership skills who will run for Church Council at the May/June congregational meeting. These members are elected for one year and not eligible for consecutive re-election.

This motion passed.

# PASTORAL WRITTEN REPORT

This may not be a typical Annual Report from the pastor—for a number of reasons: I am only serving part-time; I was only at Prince of Peace for four months in 2022; and I am the Interim Pastor, which carries a different role in the overall life of the parish.

But I can offer you some perspectives and a few statistics. The statistics of which I am aware of for 2022 are as follows:

- Confirmed members received by Affirmation of Faith—9
- Confirmed members received by Letter of Transfer—3
- Baptisms—7
- Funerals—7

The perspectives I have to share are a little less tangible, but I would hope, still helpful:

Prince of Peace has “bottomed out”. Starting with COVID, Prince of Peace has dealt with a number of difficult circumstances recently. If one were to chart Prince of Peace on a graph, one would see a decline in attendance, a decline in giving, and a decline in membership. But I believe that graph has now bottomed out, and we are starting to see some positive changes.

My sense is that attendance is on the upswing, giving is slowly increasing, and the membership loss has abated. In other words, things are looking up. Prince of Peace is a long way from where it was years ago in terms of size and membership, but we have stopped shrinking! I believe that.

My perspective is that there is tremendous, new and exciting energy at PoP. This energy is powering new initiatives for service and outreach and education. I want to encourage all of you to be a part of this energy surge in the coming months. Good things are happening.

We still have significant concerns, of course. But these concerns can and will be addressed in a positive way.

In short, I am impressed by the ministry of the People of God at Prince of Peace Lutheran. I am honored and blessed to be a part of this new excitement. I look forward to the time I will be spending with you in 2023.

# WORSHIP & MUSIC

The Worship and Music Committee here at Prince of Peace assists our pastor and director of music in offering worship that is a lively and faithful telling of the Christian story in word, sacrament, and song. The committee's work includes planning for worship services, ministry through music including our church ensembles and programs, maintenance of invested instruments and arranging for paid and volunteer music staff.

Creativity and innovation have remained at the center of the work of the Worship & Music Committee. In 2022 the committee continued to work very hard to sustain our worship and music ministry despite the continuation of the global pandemic, subsequent state recommendations, and the need for social distancing to keep our members safe. The committee diligently worked on reintegrating lost practices due the pandemic, including the return of the sung liturgy, the integration of communion kits and the reinstatement of Holy Eucharist at the rail via intinction. As we moved into our 'new normal' we have also seen the return and growth of the Sanctuary Choir with new and old music alike, the Handbell Choir and the Youth Music program with its ongoing Mulder organ project.

Another new move we championed was a new service, Christmas Eve, Eve, Eve, Eve! This allowed families both within our congregation and the greater community the opportunity to share in the birth of Jesus, here at home, whereas otherwise they might have been traveling. We also experimented with a "lighter" service for Christmas Day. The committee also developed the Organ Task Force to address the concerns surrounding the condition of the pipe organ in the sanctuary, spurred on by a report from the Austin Organ Company received in the winter of 2021.

As we look forward into 2023 the Worship and Music Committee's goals include the continued growth of our worship experiences and the music ministry that supports them including the future status of the organ. We envision a continued offering of multiple options for members to join in both service and dialogue.

A huge thank you to our 2022 Worship and Music Committee members for their dedication to Prince of Peace and our future growth. The following members participated in the committee during this past year: Heidi Adam, Nancy Carlson, Susi Lehmann, Tina Giubileo, Marci Sharp, Brian Muller, Donna Vitetta, Pr. Paul Lutz, and Pr. Mark Grorud. On behalf of the committee, I also want to extend a huge thank you to Tina Giubileo, who stepped down this fall, for the countless hours she has contributed over many years, guiding, and keeping the committee moving forward despite the pandemic and changes. Her presence will be missed.

2022 was another challenging yet rewarding year for Prince of Peace volunteers at Loaves & Fishes food pantry in New Milford. Previously, our church had 4 supervisors that led PoPs' volunteers at Loaves & Fishes each 2nd Sunday of the month. In 2022 we lost 2 long term Supervisors; Casey Johansen who moved and the unfortunate passing of Donna Wright. Presently, myself and Janet Hisser are supervisors, and we have a small group of volunteers consisting of some folks with L&F experience, and some new volunteers who have graciously stepped up to help with volunteering.

In past years Loaves & Fishes would typically serve hot meals and take out lunches to 20 to 30 visitors for the Sunday afternoon sessions. Since the pandemic, L&F now averages around 8 visitors per sitting. During the pandemic L&F had changed the format to handing out take-out meals with no inside sit-down service. Mid-year 2022 L&F switched back to the afternoon sit down hot meal format again. Attendance numbers remain low right now.

# PRINCE OF PEACE CEMETERY ASSOCIATION

The past year was a busy one for the Prince of Peace Cemetery Association. There were ten burials, eight of which were cremation burials handled by committee members. Plot sales increased this year over past years.

The cemetery contains 464 full burial plots. Of those, 298 have been sold, 10 are classified as "Do not sell" because of ground impediments leaving 156 full plots available. There are 213 cremation plots. Of those, 154 have been sold, 11 are classified as "Do not sell" because of location or ground impediments leaving 48 cremation plots available. The committee can revise these numbers if cremation plots continue being requested at the current rate by dividing up full plots. A full plot can be divided into 3 cremation plots. This was last done a few years ago when 4 rows of full plots from rows I, J, K and L were subdivided. There are 68 veterans buried at Prince of Peace.

After holding plot costs steady for almost ten years, the Cemetery Committee recommended to increase the price for cremation plots by \$100. The new prices, which will be in effect starting January 1, 2023, are \$400 for members and \$550 for non-members. The cost of full plots will remain \$700 for members and \$1000 for non-members. Cremation plot openings will remain at \$250. The cost for opening a full plot varies and is handled through an independent contractor. These charges are usually included in burial arrangements made with a funeral home. Additional information about the cemetery may be obtained by contacting Ernie Lehman or the church office.

No major improvements were done in 2022. In 2023 we plan to deal with weed growth along the inside walls of the cemetery and "rejuvenate" an area near the wall which has seen large dead patches after a number of years of dry conditions. Mowing, weed, and insect control will be handled by independent vendors. Weekly maintenance will continue to be done by committee members. One other quick note – even though we spent more than we earned with respect to our budget, our investment income more than covered that deficit. We were also blessed with a gift of \$15,000 from the estate of a family who has loved ones buried in the cemetery.

# WOMEN OF THE ELCA

In, March, seven Prince of Peace women bravely retreated to Camp Calumet. Nancy Tolmoff led the retreat. Information for the 2023 annual retreat, which will be held on March 24-26, will be in the February and the March Blueprints. The sign-up sheet will be posted in March on a table in the Narthex. (Mark your calendars as this is a great time to relax and enjoy the weekend with other women (and friends) from Prince of Peace. We have been going on this annual retreat over 30 years and would love to share it with those who have attended before and new members as well.

In October, Edith Sherman and myself attended the New England Synod of the Women of the ELCA convention at Camp Calumet. It was good to see friends that we hadn't seen in several years due to COVID.

Three on-going knitting/crocheting projects continue to keep our women's hands busy. The first one is for the "Prayer Shawl Ministry". Prayer Shawls are knitted, and prayers are said over the shawls as they are being knitted. The shawls are then given to individuals who are sick or in need of this special comfort. The second knitting project is blankets and caps for infants and toddlers that are sent to Global Health Ministries. The 3<sup>rd</sup> project is Hats and Scarves for the Seafarer's...we send them to North Haven and they are handed out to the sailors there. All projects are a part of Caring Ministries.

The Craft Fair (2022) was held on the first Saturday in November. Prince of Peace women divided up the leadership for each of the booths. We received a grant from Thrivent to help cover the cost of food for the lunchroom because there wasn't enough donated. The fair made over \$2,000 again this year.

In conjunction with the "Easter Egg Hunt" for the community, we had a bake sale and monies raised were given to that project. In December, along with the "Breakfast with Santa" and the following Sunday, we held a small boutique of craft items and a cookie sale....Over \$300 was raised and donated to the Daily Bread Food Pantry. Monies were also sent for the Ukraine Fund through synod and we are currently remodeling the bathroom in the green room.

# PRINCE OF PEACE PRE-SCHOOL

Prince of Peace Pre-School serves the greater Brookfield area through offering pre-school services to families with 3 to 5 year olds. The Pre-School currently hosts 71 students and employs 15 Staff members (13 teaching staff members, 1 Assistant Director and 1 Director). We offer two, three, and five day part day (9am-12pm) and full day 9(am-2pm) class options.

This year, all preschool activities are in-person and families can bring their children directly to their classroom. Enrichment events, such as gym classes, and gingerbread house decorating events have taken place in Fellowship Hall, and we have hosted 6 holiday concerts. The families have been so happy to have access to the building again and are grateful for the enrichment opportunities we are providing.

On December 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022, an accreditor from the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) visited the preschool to assess our program for reaccreditation. While we were nervous about the visit, our work over the last 2 ½ years has prepared us and gives us confidence that we will be reaccredited. We expect to have a decision on our accreditation status within 90 days and if reaccredited, the status will be valid for a 5-year period.

Currently, our largest goal is to increase program marketing efforts. To this end, a Prince of Peace (PoP) Preschool sign has been created and hung on the fence below Kids Kingdom in Brookfield, we have begun a PoP preschool Instagram account and notified both current and past families about the account, have updated the school entry to make it visually more appealing, and are working on a new road sign, which will be updated and hopefully relocated to improve visibility. Beginning next year, we plan to update the preschool website. This will require outside support and will need to be budgeted for accordingly.

We are truly appreciative of the support we have received and continue to receive from Steve Murphy, Priscilla Mancinone, Rich Mercado, Rene Tuccillo, Trish Leary and Paul Adam. They are instrumental in helping the pre-school run smoothly.
