I encourage you to attend our Biannual Budget Meeting so that you can be well informed about the proposed 2026 Program on Ministry. Following discussion, there will be a vote on the budget. There are other important items on the agenda for this meeting as well.

Monthly Consent:

- Motion to approve the Meeting Agenda, December Financials, and December Minutes was made by Meg and a second by Johnny. Council unanimously agreed to approve.

Pastors Report

- Worship schedule and times for Ash Wednesday, February 18th and Holy Week are being discussed/set.
- Pastor shared a Lenten activity for the entire congregation to participate in around the book "A 40 Day Journey with Parker Palmer". This Lenten devotional activity is designed for prayer partners to discuss the book. More details to follow.
- The Wednesday evening Lenten services will not be offered on zoom.

2x2 Conversation

- Discussion on the "2x2" sermon format on Sunday, January 11, 2026 was favorable among council members. One challenge was for those on zoom and ways to make it engaging. A future sermon format Sunday will be planned after Easter.
- Timing for Council Serves Sunday were discussed.

Tithey Roll Out

- The new App rolled out on January 18, 2026. Tina Halas has volunteered to be the "tester" as details get "ironed out".

Communication of Congregational Meeting

- The Annual Congregational Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, February 22, 2026 after the church service.
- Lorraine is chairing the Nominating Committee and individuals are currently being asked to be on the committee. Council will approve the Nominating Committee at the February meeting.
- A letter/email goes out this week with Constitution amendments and a draft agenda.

Votes

- A motion to approve the council approved 2026 budget was made by Tim and a second by Chris. Council unanimously agreed to approve.
- A motion to temporarily suspend C 13.02 of the Constitution requiring the Nominating Committee to have 6 members and proceed with 3 members for this cycle was made by Johnny and a second by Karen. Council unanimously agreed to approve. This vote will also be presented to the full Congregation at the annual meeting. If approved Lorraine and three additional members would serve as the Nominating Committee for this cycle.

Faith Formation for Lent: 40-Day Journey with Parker Palmer

Few Protestant writers today can match the influence of Parker Palmer on American spirituality, contemplative practice, and Quaker values. Palmer, who is founder and senior partner of the Center for Courage & Renewal, a non-profit organization that provides support for people in the service professions, has published dozens of poems, essays, and seven books, including the bestselling *A Hidden Wholeness: The Journey toward an Undivided Life*.

Drawing from his published works, series editor Henry French here selects 40 inspiring passages from Palmer's writings that reflect Palmer's spiritual journey and invites readers to explore their own spirituality under the guidance of this noted author, educator, and activist.

40-Day Journey with Parker J. Palmer opens with a short introduction to the life of Parker Palmer and then offers forty chapters, each of which includes a reading from his writings, related Scripture passages, questions to ponder, journal-reflection exercises, and a prayer. The book also includes helps on how to use the book and hints on keeping a journal along with ideas for further reading. Each chapter in the book includes space for notes.

For a bit of a twist, all participants will be paired with a Reflection Partner for a weekly check-in on the week's readings (check-ins are at the discretion of the Partners - send emails, hop on a phone/Facetime/ Zoom call, go out for coffee, chat during Sunday morning hospitality time, grab a pizza, or walk some laps at Danbury Fair Mall!).

Good Tidings!...from Pastor Michael Anderson

John 1:35-38a

35 The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, 36 and as he watched Jesus walk by he exclaimed, “Look, here is the Lamb of God!” 37 The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. 38 When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, “What are you looking for?”

There has been a John the Baptist in our lives. By someone or something, we have been directed toward Jesus. Our sense that he means something to us has been kindled. In some way, perhaps at a distance and with trepidation, we have followed him. But now at the threshold of Ash Wednesday and Lent he turns and asks us, “What are you looking for?” What, indeed.

Individually and as a community, the answer could be anything. But on deeper reflection there *will* be an answer to that question. There always is. Walking the way of Christ and of the cross is a response to the invitation and inspiration of the Holy Spirit that has flooded our hearts, tugged us forward, and urged us onward. We do not resist it. Lent is many things, but chief among them is a season of preparation for baptismal renewal on the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord. So, again, “What are you looking for?”

Simplest perhaps is just to say, “more life.” Those two little words, “more life,” are an umbrella covering infinite specifics about what they can mean. Yielding to the Spirit to learn what “more life” means for us is the faith of putting one foot in front of the other and receiving with an open heart the Life Jesus has to give you. It doesn’t come to us all at once - it unfolds within us as only to...lead us further in the Way of Christ and his cross.

Lent is here as preparation for our yielding, for our walk, for our sensitivity to the working of the Spirit. Where these days deposit us is the only place that is our home: God’s grace shown in watery font. May these days be a blessing for you as we anticipate the renewal of God’s great salvation in Christ at the center of our lives.

Awake, O Sleeper, Rise from Death

1 Awake, O sleeper, rise from death,
and Christ shall give you light;
so learn his love, its length and breadth,
its fullness, depth, and height.
4 Then walk in love as Christ has loved,
who died that he might save;
with kind and gentle hearts forgive
as God in Christ forgave.

5 For us Christ lived, for us he died,
and conquered in the strife.
Awake, arise, go forth in faith,
and Christ shall give you life.


We have chosen the first book for the February meeting.

Daily Bread Food Pantry Update

Thank you for your generosity with food and other items for the recipients. Here are a few numbers about the Food Pantry on Park Avenue in Danbury and at the original location at St Andrew Episcopal Church. Over 4,900 unique households were served (or 17,150 unique individuals) welcoming them for a total of 33,000 visits. Shoppers carried away \$2.5 million of food of their choice. 501 Volunteers worked 27,500 volunteer hours.

A visit to the food pantry is a wonderful experience. Volunteers are helpful and smiling. Translators are available. There's an activity center for children to stay as adults shop.

Food is presented as people shop for their food preferences in a path around the building. Nutritional food is valued in a point system where fruit and vegetables are more available in lower numbers and ultra-processed and high fat items "cost" more. The Nutritional Department of UConn has established a program to teach clients about the benefits of basic nutrition.

How can we help?

The best donation is money that food can be bought at lower prices and purchase foods that are not available through donations.

- Consider donations of low sugar and salt content.
- Consider nonperishables with current expiration dates in non breakable containers.
- Cereals, tea, coffee, baby food, condiments like ketchup, mustard, hot sauce.
- Baking supplies like flour, sugar, cake mixes.
- Shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, laundry detergent.
- Soap, paper towels, toilet paper, feminine hygiene products, cleaning supplies.
- Used books for children. Portuguese, Spanish.

Thank you for your donations. Remember to pray for food insecure people.
