Travel plans in the works

Seniors over 65 are now a priority. To sign up for your vaccine, go to <https://www.vaccines.nh.gov/> or you can call 211. The key part—be patient. We have found that it may take a lot of time, but the people on the other end are very helpful.

Senior Center elections are coming! Candidates needed for Board of Directors.

Board members are elected for 2 year terms with the option to be elected for a second 2 year term. After 2 terms, they must take a year off before serving another pair of terms. So, some members of the Board will be standing down at the end of their term. We need members to take their place. If you can give the center some of your time, we need your help. Elections are scheduled in May, but candidates need to be listed in April for members to review. So the deadline is March 15 to get on the list. Contact the center for information on what is required to be a Board Director. Do you have what it takes? We need your help. Letters of intent to run are due by March 15.

There is also an election of a Finance committee member. Or can you serve as a member of the Nominating committee, determining eligibility and conducting the election? Ask if you are interested.

No experience is necessary. Just an interest in helping the center and a willingness to commit some time.

Ken Shares recipe
Meatloaf with Brown Sugar Glaze

Meatloaf

1 ½ pounds lean ground beef
¾ cup milk
1 egg beaten
1 teaspoons salt
1 cup bread crumbs
1 packet onion soup mix
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
¼ teaspoon ground black pepper

Sauce

½ cup ketchup
¼ cup packed brown sugar
¼ cup apple cider vinegar



Directions

- 1: Preheat oven to 350° F (175° C) Lightly grease a 5 x 9 loaf pan.
- 2: Gently crumble ground beef into a bowl, breaking up into small pieces. Add remaining meatloaf ingredients to the bowl and gently combine. Be careful not to overwork the meat.
3. Mix all the sauce ingredients together and spread half of the sauce along the bottom and sides of the loaf pan.
4. Add meatloaf to the loaf pan and press firmly into a loaf shape.
5. Liberally paint remaining sauce over the top of the loaf.
6. Place meatloaf pan into oven and bake for 1 hour and 10 minutes, or until the internal temperature reads 165 F°.
- 7 Let rest for 5 minutes. Serve slices.

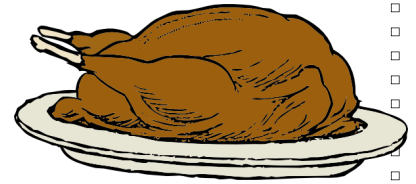

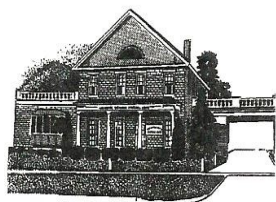
