Even though COVID numbers are still high in New Hampshire and Claremont in particular, the Board decided to reopen with precautions in place to protect our Seniors. We have installed microbio filters in all rooms. Our dot system is intended to identify those persons unvaccinated since they pose the highest risk of infections.



The Board felt these measures are enough to not requiring masks for everyone. Of course, anyone who wants to wear a mask is welcome to wear one.

We are resuming all activities except indoor dining. Bingo will still be on Wednesday afternoons, but we will be increasing the price of paper cards. Our hours are the same, and listed on page 2.



Either hang up or don't answer if it is a name or number you don't know. If you answer the phone and someone threatens you with arrest, freezing your bank account or promises an increase in your Social Security payment, hang up. It is a scammer. You can get more information on scams at www.oig.dhs.gov.

Show us your Vaccine Card and get your Center Vaccine Card

The numbers have not diminished. The policy is no vaccine, wear a mask. When entering the building, show your card at the desk for a “Dot of the Day”. 
